November is the month the Church dedicates to praying for the faithful departed. We begin with All Souls' Day (2 November), a solemn reminder of our communion with those who have gone before us. Throughout this month, we are invited to remember our loved ones who have died and to commend them to God's mercy through prayer and the Holy Mass. It's a beautiful tradition to offer a Mass for the souls of the departed, entrusting them to God's eternal embrace.

Our normal practice for Mass offerings at St Benedict's is to use a Mass offering envelope, which can be found at the back of the church, and give them directly to one of our priests.

We always honour these requests, though not always on the exact requested date, as only one intention can be offered per Mass. Requests for specific dates and anniversaries are prioritised whenever possible.

Please note that Mass offerings are not always announced publicly unless specifically requested.

Any donations given for Mass offerings are not used for the parish or clergy, but are directly given to those in need. Let us take this month to hold our beloved loved ones in prayer, confident in the hope of the resurrection.

First Reading Is 25:6-9

The Lord God will destroy death for ever.

On this mountain, the Lord of hosts will prepare for all peoples a banquet of rich food. On this mountain he will remove the mourning veil covering all peoples, and the shroud enwrapping all nations, he will destroy Death for ever. The Lord will wipe away the tears from every cheek; he will take away his peoples shame everywhere on earth, for the Lord has said so. That day, it will be said: See, this is our God in whom we hoped for salvation; the Lord is the one in whom we hoped. We exult and we rejoice that he has saved us.

Responsorial Psalm

Ps 26:1, 4.7-9, 13-14, Rv.1, Alt. R v.13 (R.) The Lord is my light and my salvation.

- The Lord is my light and my help; whom shall I fear? The Lord is the stronghold of my life; before whom shall I shrink? (R.)
- 2. There is one thing I ask of the Lord, for this I long, to live in the house of the Lord. all the days of my life. to savour the sweetness of the Lord. to behold his temple. (R.)

Second Reading Rom 5:5-11

Having been justified by his blood, we will be saved from God's anger through him.

Hope is not deceptive, because the love of God has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit which has been given us. We were still helpless when at his appointed moment Christ died for sinful men. It is not easy to die even for a good man - though of course

for someone really worthy, a man might be prepared to die – but what proves that God loves us is that Christ died for us while we were still sinners. Having died to make us righteous, is it likely that he would now fail to save us from God's anger? When we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, we were still enemies; now that we have been reconciled, surely we may count on being saved by the life of his Son? Not merely because we have been reconciled but because we are filled with joyful trust in God, through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have already gained our reconciliation.

Gospel Acclamation Jn 6:39

Alleluia, alleluia! This is the will of my Father, says the Lord, that I should lose nothing of all that he has given to me, and that I should raise it up on the last dav.

Alleluia!

Gospel Lk 7:11-17

Young man, I tell you, arise.

Jesus went to a town called Nain, accompanied by his disciples and a great number of people. When he was near the gate of the town it happened that a dead man was being carried out for burial, the only son of his mother, and she was a widow. And a considerable number of the townspeople were with her. When the Lord saw her he felt sorry for her. 'Do not cry,' he said. Then he went up and put his hand on the bier and the bearers stood still, and he said, 'Young man, I tell you to get up'. And the dead man sat up and began to talk, and Jesus gave him to his mother. Everyone was filled with awe and praised God saying, great prophet has appeared among us; God has visited his people.' And this opinion of him spread throughout Judaea and all over the countryside.

Reflection by Fr Michael Tate

Today, many of us will visit the grave or plinth of a beloved member of the family or a friend. If you are like me, you will first tidy the area, prune any dead heads off the rose bush, place some fresh flowers and then pray.

The beautiful Catholic custom is that on this day especially - All Souls' Day - we pray for those who have died. We prayed for them when they were with us on earth. Death is no barrier to continuing that prayer. We pray for them and for ourselves that one day, when every tear is wiped away, we may join them in heavenly bliss.

What grounds our hope? Nothing more, nothing less, than the victory of Jesus Christ over death. We pray that those we love even now are sharing in the benefits of that triumph. For most, as I expect for me, that may involve a purging of those traits of personality which prevent the fullest participation in the bliss of Heaven. But that bliss is what God desires for each one of them and for me.

God prays for the fulfilment of that desire whilst souls are being purged (whatever that may involve). Our praying for the dead is simply our participation in this prayer of God, our privilege which we intentionally share in. Even those not intentionally sharing our faith often say R.I.P., rest in peace, and that is a prayer! And so we pray with confident Christian hope: 'Endless light shine on those we love, O Lord. May their souls and the souls of all those who have died, through the mercy of God rest in peace. Amen.'
