

# The Most Holy Trinity Year B 29 & 30 May 2021

First reading Deuteronomy 4:32-34,39-40

The Lord is God indeed: he and no other

Moses said to the people: 'Put this question to the ages that are past, that went before you, from the time God created man on earth: Was there ever a word so majestic, from one end of heaven to the other? Was anything ever heard? Did ever a people hear the voice of the living God speaking from the heart of the fire, as you heard it, and remain alive? Has any god ventured to take to himself one nation from the midst of another by ordeals, signs, wonders, war with mighty hand and outstretched arm, by fearsome terrors – all this that the Lord your God did for you before your eyes in Egypt?

'Understand this today, therefore, and take it to heart: the Lord is God indeed, in heaven above as on earth beneath, he and no other. Keep his laws and commandments as I give them to you today, so that you and your children may prosper and live long in the land that the Lord your God gives you for ever.'

Everyone moved by the Spirit is a son of God. The spirit you received is not the spirit of slaves bringing fear into your lives again; it is the spirit of sons, and it makes us cry out, 'Abba, Father!' The Spirit himself and our spirit bear united witness that we are children of

God. And if we are children we are heirs as well: heirs of God and co-heirs with Christ, sharing his sufferings so as to share his glory.

## Go and make disciples of all nations

The eleven disciples set out for Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had arranged to meet them. When they saw him they fell down before him, though some hesitated. Jesus came up and spoke to them. He said, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, make disciples of all the nations; baptise them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teach them to observe all the commands I gave you. And know that I am with you always; yes, to the end of time.'

#### **Holy Trinity**

Gods 'mighty hand' shows that there is one true God (Deuteronomy 4: 32-34). However, experience of Jesus' awareness of his Father as the source of all that he was and all that he did, led the early Christians to speak easily of God as the Father, Jesus Christ as the Son, and the gift of the Holy Spirit. Only two decades after the death of Jesus, Paul insists that life in the Spirit enables us do cry out, repeating the words of Jesus: 'Abba, Father' (See also Mark 14: 36). We are united with Christ as children of God, moved by the Spirit. Matthew's Gospel closes with the famous commission of the risen Jesus to his fearful disciples. In a profound development of the Church's

Jewish origins, Jesus affirms that all authority, traditionally belonging only to the God of Israel, has been given to him. His disciples can no longer be limited to one people but must come from all nations. The initiation rite of circumcision is to be abandoned. A new people of God will be baptised in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, and taught to observe what Jesus taught, the perfection of Israel's Law. Difficult days might lie ahead for this community, founded upon the teaching of Jesus, and baptised in Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. But the Risen Lord will be with us always—to the end of time
