

<u>Parish Renovation Appeal.</u> Thank you to those who attended last Sunday's Morning Tea. It was great to be able to gather and share a cuppa and a chat. Thank you especially to Grace, Theo, Asteria, Christine and Fr Rem who set up and decorated the Hall and provided the delicious Morning Tea.

Once again, the generosity of the St Benedict's community came to the fore this week with a **further** \$5,612 donated. Currently, donations for the Presbytery Appeal have **reached** \$83,332.00: \$56,000 from the initial donor via the MGLs and \$27,332 in the 3 weeks since the Appeal commenced.



We have a further \$22,000 to go to reach our Parish target of a contribution of \$50,000 towards the renovation.

Second Sunday in Advent Year C 4 & 5 December 2021

Lighting of the Two Candles

Today, the Second Sunday of Advent, we meet John the Baptist. Note the details in the Gospel reading: John the Baptist 'went throughout the whole Jordan district proclaiming a baptism of

repentance...' The word in the original Greek that is often translated as repentance is literally meaning 'change of heart'. One commentary adds that this kind of repentance is not about regret or guilt or shame but implies making a decision to turn around, to face a new direction. When we face away from the light, all we can see is our own shadow. When we turn towards the light our shadow and the darkness are behind us. Repentance means not only turning from what is bad, but also from many things that are good, but just not for us at this time, or turning from good things to which we have become inordinately attached and which, therefore, restrict our ability to be truly free

First reading Baruch 5:1-9

Jerusalem, take off your dress of sorrow and distress, put on the beauty of the glory of God for ever, wrap the cloak of the integrity of God around you, put the diadem of the glory of the Eternal on your head: since God means to show your splendour to every nation under heaven, since the name God gives you for ever will be, 'Peace through integrity, and honour through devotedness.'

In the fifteenth year of Tiberius Caesar's reign, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judaea, Herod tetrarch of Galilee, his brother Philip tetrarch of the lands of Ituraea and Trachonitis, Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene, during the pontificate of Annas and Caiaphas the word of God came to John son of Zechariah, in the wilderness.
