Dear St Benedict's brothers and sisters,

As the ACT Government and the Archdiocese have given Churches the go ahead to have 20 people at Mass, we have returned to our normal Weekday Masses in the Church. Please note the MGL brothers will not be continuing to stream Friday Healing Mass but they will Stream a separate Charismatic Mass as they have been, at least for the next couple of weeks.

As much as we are enjoying Steve's company and ministry, we do pray he can return to support the brotherhood, which includes our own Fr Matt and to care for the families in our Parish (which is also St Benedict's) and Mission. Amongst other things, the Brothers, including Fr Matt, are seeking to feed more than 2,000 families in their parish and 10,000 in another ministry area in a place called Payatas.
