

Archbishop Christopher Prowse's Message "Ad Limina Apostolorum" visit. This week all the bishops of Australia will make a significant visit to Rome. The formal name of this visit, Ad Limina Apostolorum, literally means "to the threshold of the Apostles". This refers to the point of reference of the visit-a visit to the tombs of St Peter and St Paul.

This visit happens periodically to all the bishops of the world. Perhaps after five or six years or more, the bishops of a particular country will spend a period of time in Rome to fulfil two principal responsibilities; to strengthen their own responsibility as successors of the apostles and to deepen their solidarity with the successor of St Peter, Pope Francis.

The time will include-special Masses at the tombs of the Apostles Peter and Paul., special Masses at the principal basilicas in Rome, an audience with the Holy Father, visits to the offices or the Holy See and a retreat with all the bishops of Australia.

Clearly, we will also be discussing at length current pastoral challenges and opportunities in Australia at present that impact on the faith of Catholics here. For example, topics such as the Plenary Council of Australia and the issues arising from the sex abuse crisis will be discussed thoroughly.



FOR THE INFORMATION OF PARISHIONERS **LENT 2019**

The Lenten season has a twofold character:

- it recalls baptism or prepares for it. 1)
- 2) it stresses a penitential spirit.

By these means especially, Lent readies the faithful for celebrating the paschal mystery after a period of closer attention to the Word of God, and more ardent prayer. In the liturgy itself and in the liturgy-centred instructions, these baptismal and penitential themes should be more pronounced. Hence:

- Wider use is to be made of baptismal features proper to the Lenten liturgy... a)
- The same approach holds for the penitential elements... *b*)

During Lent, penance should not be only internal and individual but also external and social...

In any event, let the paschal fast be kept sacred. It should be observed everywhere on Good Friday and, where possible prolonged throughout Holy Saturday, so that the joys of the Sunday of the resurrection may be visited on uplifted and responsive spirits.

Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, Vatican II

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fasting and Abstinence from meat.

On all other Fridays, except solemnities, the law of the common practice of penance is fulfilled by performing any one of the following:

(a) **Prayer**- for example, Mass attendance; family prayer; a visit to a church or chapel; reading the Bible; making the Stations of the Cross; praying the Rosary; or in other ways.

(b) **Self-Denial** - for example, not eating meat; not eating sweets or dessert; giving up

entertainment to spend time with the family; limiting food and drink so as to give to the poor of one's own country or elsewhere; or in other ways. Project Compassion is a

major means of expressing our self-denial in Australia.

© Helping Others- for example, special attention to someone who is poor, sick, elderly, lonely or over-burdened; or in other ways.

All who have completed their eighteenth year and have not yet begun their sixtieth year are bound to fast. All who have completed their fourteenth year are bound to abstain (Canon 1252).

The Season of Lent is a time of penance.

Each of the faithful is obliged to receive Holy Communion at least once a year. This tween Ash Wednesday, 6 March and Trinity Sunday, 16 during the year.

• The wonderful gift of the Lord's merciful love is offered in a special way in the

• Sacrament of Reconciliation. Lent is a most appropriate time to receive this Sacrament. All the faithful who have reached the age of discretion are bound faithfully to confess their grave sins at least once a year.

HOLY WEEK - The 2019 Ordo contains instructions for the Rites of Holy Week. FUNERALS - On Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday all Masses for the Dead, Including Funeral Masses, **are forbidden**. Funerals on these days are celebrated with the Liturgy of the Word and without the Eucharistic Sacrifice.
