### ARCHDIOCESAN GUIDELINES FOR CATHOLIC FUNERALS

The priest determines the content and form of the funeral liturgy, keeping in mind the wishes of the family. Terms such as 'Words of Remembrance' or 'Reflections' of the persons life' are preferable to 'Eulogy'. It is not necessary to have a Eulogy. The priest can be given some information about the deceased to use in his homily.

**LENGTH:** a couple of appropriate reflections that will bring out the character of the person without going into too much historical detail. Memories of the deceased could be shared at a viewing, in a separate moment before the Mass or Liturgy of the Word. POWERPOINT PRESENTATIONS are not appropriate during a Catholic funeral. We do not like calling a Catholic funeral a 'Celebration of Life'... because it does not reflect the full depth and meaning of our understanding of funerals.

Music for a Catholic funeral is liturgical. Appropriate hymns or music should be chosen. Romantic ballads, popular or rock music, political or football club songs are not appropriate. But a song like that could be used after the burial service. For further information visit www.cgcatholic.org.au
