THE ADVENT WREATH. Advent comes from the Latin word 'adventus' meaning 'Coming.' Advent begins the church year starting four Sundays before Christmas. The season of Advent has been set aside as a time of preparation since the 6th century. Advent is also a time for preparing for Christ's second coming, even as we remember and celebrate his first coming at Christmas. This is why the colour of the season of Lent is used, purple or blue, the colours also of Lent, of forgiveness and repentance. The Advent Wreath has four purple candles and one of white. The first candle is lit on Advent Sunday; additional ones are lit, one on each Sunday, and the white on Christmas Day. Celebrating Advent is an excellent way to prepare your mind and heart for Christmas.

Advent Candle Lighting Today is the first Sunday of Advent, so we light the first candle on our Advent wreath: the candle of Hope.

Leader: May your hearts be filled with hope as you hear the promises God made to bless all the peoples on earth through Abraham, the father of our faith.

All: Thanks be to God

Today is the First Sunday of Advent, we will light a candle to remember the Patriachs, Abraham Isaac and Jacob, the ancestors of our faith. (A person lights the first candle here) Let us pray: ALL: Lord Jesus we give thanks for our Father Abraham who by faith obeyed your call and became the father of many nations. Give us faith to listen to your voice that our hearts may be filled with the hope of our Lord Jesus. Amen.

Second Phase of the Plenary Council Archbishop Christopher would like to encourage all during the Advent period to continue to seek the wisdom of the Holy Spirit as we focus on the themes iden tified by the first phase of prayer and listening. The second phase will move into a time of Listening and Communal discernment. All are invited to discern together, how guided by the Holy Spirit, we can renew our parish and the Australian church.
