A REFLECTION ON LITURGICAL BOOKS ON THE WORD OF GOD SUNDAY

English is the language in which we hear God's word. Biblical scholars have the important role in studying the scriptures and advising the bishops as to the proper meaning of the scriptures and the language best to convey that to others. The current lectionary uses the 1981 Jerusalem Bible translation. In May, 1990, the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference, approved four other scriptural translations for use in the lituray: the New Jerusalem Bible, the New Revised Standard Version, the New American Bible, and the Good News Bible. These translations could be substituted for the lectionary readings as necessary. Eleven years later, it issued its Statement of Principles: Language and the Liturgy. Principle 2 of the eight states, "all new and revised liturgical books need to use accurate and inclusive language, though the approval of liturgical books must be respected absolutely." Progress thereafter was slow, in part due to the reception of the New Roman Missal which is what we use in Mass today. In recent years, progress has been made such that, in 2021, the New Zealand Catholic Bishops Conference accepted the invitation of the Australian bishops to help produce a new lectionary based on the Revised New Jerusalem Bible. This bible uses inclusive language and is based upon the currently approved translation.

REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate The Divine Touch

The mother-in-law of Simon (Peter) was sick in bed with a raging fever. When Jesus learned about her distressed state, he 'took her by the hand and helped her up'. He broke the taboo about physical contact with a woman not his relative because he wanted to holistically heal her dis-ease. Simon's mother-in-law didn't need an aspirin and a cup of tea. She felt quarantined, isolated, and needed a hand reassuring her of sociable relationships. Jesus overcame her fever and her disease with the world.

At every Mass we exchange a physical gesture at the greeting of Peace. This quite often overcomes being ill-at-ease with a family member or just with the neighbour in the pew. We need to take that symbolic action into the world. For somebody, it may be the most touching thing we ever do.
