Observing the spatial distancing as required by the government, following are the maximum seating capacity for our respective churches: Merimbula Heads: 74 Eden: 60. With this regards, bookings are still essential for WEEKEND MASSES only. Please call or email the Parish office. You can reserve a place for one Mass each weekend and for the following week as well. Should there be no answer, please leave your name and number and we will get back to you. Until we are back to full swing, following must be observed when attending Mass for the meantime: 1. Sign in with your name, contact number and signature before taking your seat. 2. SPATIAL DISTANCING OF AT LEAST 1.5 METERS FROM EACH OTHER MUST BE OBSERVED. PLEASE SIT ONLY IN MARKED PLACES. 3. Holy communion shall be received on the hand only. Chalice will not be distributed. 6. No Passing of Collection plates - you may place your envelopes/donations in the designated boxes placed at the side of the entrance door. 7. No Offertory Procession 8. No Sign of Peace, no Holy Water 9. Those who are unwell or at high risk due to compromised immune or respiratory system should not attend, those over 70 should exercise particular caution. "You can keep Sunday holy by setting aside some time for prayer at home, reading the Scriptures of the day, watching Mass on television or online, and asking God for the graces you would normally receive in Holy Communion." BRINGING THE SCRIPTURES TO LIFE

Are you interested in developing your ability to proclaim the scriptures in a way which brings them to life for the listener, simply by telling the story as though we are first-hand witnesses?

Ray and Fenella Temmerman, of Winnipeg, Canada, having spent time in Merimbula each year for the last 4 years. They now find themselves 'locked down', unable easily to return to their home in Canada. As Ray says, if you have to be locked down somewhere, there are FAR worse places to be locked down than in Merimbula!

Ray studied theology and scripture at St Paul's Seminary in Kensington, NSW, 1976-80, then in retirement completed a Masters in Sacred Theology at the University of Winnipeg. He now offers workshops on proclaiming the scriptures. This is how he describes their content:

"I begin by exploring why we proclaim the scriptures. Then I use an Ignation form of reflection to draw people into scripture as a lived experience. We then take time to practice experiencing the scriptures. Finally, we begin the actual practice of proclamation, giving people a chance to tell the scripture story, learn what they are doing well, as well as what they could improve on and how. The process has worked well, with people picking up and applying practical tips to help them improve their proclamation."

Even if you've been a lector for many years, you'll still find some good tips about how to make proclaiming the scriptures an uplifting experience, and receive suggestions on practical aspects such as using the microphone well.

Ray normally runs the workshop over a 3-hour period. He particularly appreciates if people from different churches can join in, all of us together coming to experience the Word of God as brothers and sisters in Christ.

2020 Sacramental Program Resumes

PLENARY COUNCIL—SOME CHALLENGES

Due to COVID-19, the Plenary Council will now take place in Adelaide on October 2021 and Sydney in July 2022. May I offer four challenges and reflections.

A journey of the Holy Spirit: The Plenary Council is a work of the Holy Spirit. This means we journey together by way of silence, listening and patient discernment. This is the most important foundation we must all share. Already this journey has taken us over two years. We need to assess how we have fared in this challenge. I would say we have much room for improvement.

- 2. **Confusion over the word "governance"**: The key word "governance" requires greater definition. It has a theological meaning; it is a derivative of our baptism whereby we share in the mission of Christ as Priest (sanctifying), Prophet (teaching) and King (governing). It also has a corporate meaning. Good governance is anchored in administrative processes and protocols alongside essential words like "transparency" and "accountability". The Catholic Church has much to learn from this corporate meaning.
- 3. The change in Catholic demographics: The recently deceased and loved member of the Plenary Council Facilitation Team, Columban priest Fr Noel Connolly, wrote: "By 2050, 80% of Catholics (globally) will live in or trace their origins to the Global South.

"The typical Christian will soon be a poor coloured woman from a shantytown in Kinshasa, Buenos Aires, Manila or some other large city in the majority world... 49% of all Australians are born overseas or have a parent born overseas."

We are challenged to do more to engage our huge vibrant Catholic migrant and youth communities.

4. **To agree on evangelisation as the key**: Surely we all agree evangelisation is the key pastoral paradigm of the Plenary Council. Discernment is still required as to how this paradigm is to engage practically our complex Australian evolving culture and those on the periphery of life, especially our First Australians.
