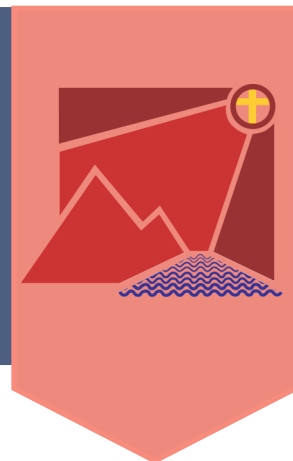

Term One seems now like a distant memory! We got off to such a vibrant and colourful start welcoming our fresh faced Kinder students and bringing together our new year 7 cohort.

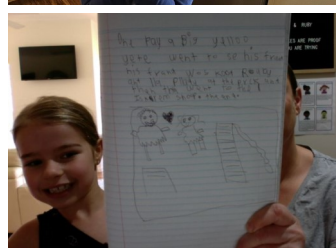
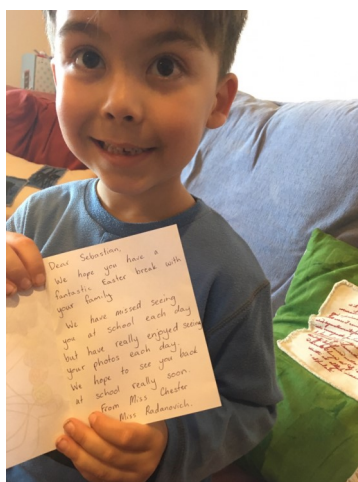

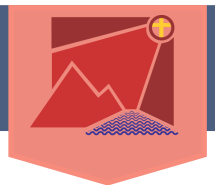
# KINDERGARTEN 2020

# YEAR 7 CAMP



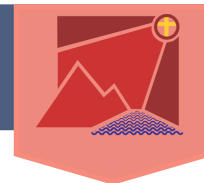

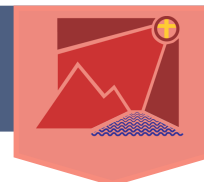
# SWIMMING CARNIVALS

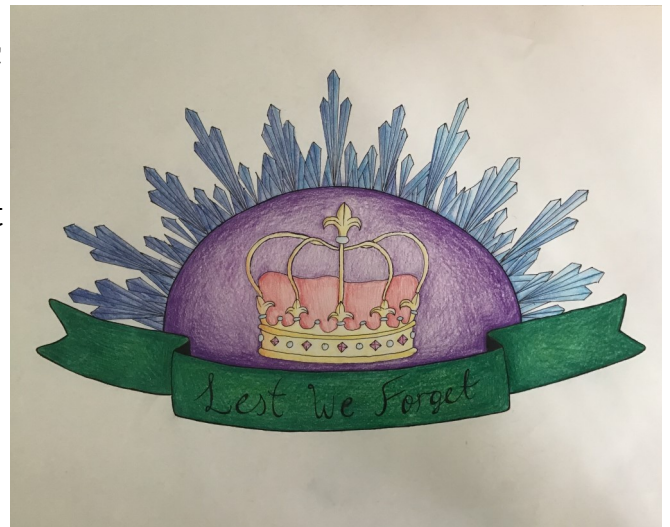
Prior to COVID-19 Year 9 Project Based Learning (PBL) students were tasked to run the College ANZAC assembly as well as take part in the community ANZAC commemorations.

The students had some great ideas about how they would represent and commemorate the ANZAC spirit and were disappointed when ANZAC commemorations and services were cancelled as a result of Covid 19.

Rather than finish the project abruptly, staff and students looked for other ways to continue the project remotely, choosing instead to create a Digital ANZAC Assembly including poetry, music and artworks as well some fascinating War time Fact pieces that demonstrate the students learning about WW1 and WW2 and the ANZAC contribution to these campaigns.

The ANZAC 2065 project challenged the students to think about how ANZAC day will look for its 150th year with a focus on the ANZAC ideals of Courage, Endurance, Mateship and Sacrifice and how these were lived out in war time, today and into the future.

As a part of the project, students looked at how these ANZAC ideals link to the Catholic Social Teachings of the College and how they can be seen in the actions of members of our community. Students identified the brilliant work of organisations in the recent bushfire season and the commitment and courage of all essential workers keeping our country going during this Covid pandemic as shining examples of how the ANZAC ideals are lived out today.
