DEAR PARISHIONERS, THIS NEWSLETTER IS MY WAY OF KEEPING IN TOUCH WITH YOU AND TO UPDATE AND SHARE NEWS ACROSS THE ARCHDIOCESE.

HOLY THURSDAY - Washing of the feet; Order of Priesthood; The New Commandment of love: Love one another; Institution of the Eucharist. During this time of social distancing during the Corona Virus pandemic, it will be sad that we will not be able to participate in person in the celebration of Holy Thursday. The live streaming of the liturgy will not involve the traditional washing of the feet - so much a part of this celebration.



On Holy Thursday, we celebrate three anniversaries:

- 1. the anniversary of the first Holy Mass,
- 2. the anniversary of the institution of ministerial priesthood to perpetuate the Holy Mass, convey God's forgiveness to all and to preach the Good News of salvation,
- 3. the anniversary of Jesus' promulgation of his new commandment of love: "Love one another as I have loved you" (John 13:34).

Today we remember how Jesus transformed the Jewish Passover into the New Testament Passover. The Jewish Passover was, in fact, a joint celebration of two ancient thanksgiving celebrations. The descendants of Abel, who were shepherds, used to lead their sheep from winter pastures to summer pastures after the sacrificial offering of a lamb to God. They called this celebration the "Passover." The descendants of Cain, who were farmers, held a harvest festival called the Massoth in which they offered unleavened bread to God as an act of thanksgiving. The Passover feast of the Israelites (Exodus 12:26-37) was a harmonious combination of these two ancient feasts of thanksgiving, commanded by the Lord God and celebrated yearly by all Israelites, to thank God for His miraculous liberation of their ancestors from Egyptian slavery, their exodus from Egypt, and their final arrival into the Promised Land.

On Holy Thursday we commemorate the gift of the Eucharist, given to us at the Last Supper. We pass over from sin and death to mercy, communion and the fullness of life, through Jesus' total gift of himself. On this day when we especially celebrate the Lord's gift to us of His Body and Blood, we should realize even more deeply that to know personally our Eucharistic Jesus means that no fear will rule our lives. When we receive the Body and Blood of Jesus, we receive God, who is Love. We receive perfect Love, which "casts out all fear" (1 Jn 4:18).



The Eucharist is the fulfillment of the Passover, when the Lord commanded His people to leave the slavery of fear. After the first Eucharist, Jesus fearlessly died on the cross. The Eucharist is where the fearful become fearless by the transforming love of the Lord. **KNOW JESUS. NO FEAR**.
