I always remembered what St. Mother Teresa said, **Priest of Jesus Christ, celebrate this Holy Mass as if it were your first Mass, your last Mass, your only Mass**... Let us pray that the Good Shepherd touch the heart of many men and women and respond to the call to priesthood and religious life.

I am overwhelmed with an experience of gratitude as I recall the five years of my priesthood that I have spent here at all Mass centres. I thank God for the gift of holy Priesthood.

I thank you dear parishioners, for your faith, your love, and your devotion to Jesus. My own faith journey has been helped by being part of yours. I am so grateful to each of you for the impact that you have had on me, and my faith as we have grown together as disciples of Jesus Christ. Thank you for accepting me as your brother in Christ. I appreciate your faith, commitment, openness, prayers, encouragements, and support. I am grateful to you for your kindness and generosity, which you have shown me in so many ways. The dedication, support, and laughter. The support and cooperation of different Ministries and Committees and parish contacts. Even as I go forth to my new assignment in Samoa, I will always hold you all in my heart, especially at the altar of God. I would like to close with two of my favourite Scripture passages from St. Paul's letter to the Philippians: 1:3-6, 9-11 *I thank my God every time I remember you. In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus.*

And this is my prayer: that your love may abound more and more in knowledge and depth of insight, so that you may be able to discern what is best and may be pure and blameless for the day of Christ, filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ—to the glory and praise of God.

Philippians 4:8 Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is honourable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things.

REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate The Power of Remembering

If you memorise a tune or your 'times tables', you are said to 'know it by heart'. The sort of person who will always remember me is someone who 'knows me by heart'. Here, a tortured criminal starts his plea: 'Jesus . . . '. This is one of only two instances where Jesus is addressed by his name which means 'The Lord saves'. The good thief went on: 'remember me when you come into Your Kingdom'. Jesus 'knows him by heart' and promises that He will remember him in Paradise. This is an exercise of sovereignty which befits 'Christ the King'. This is all the Kingly power which you or I will ever need, but to confidently invoke it we need to position ourselves alongside Jesus, like the 'good thief'. We do this by our practical concern for the poor and by coming to Mass which re-members the Body of Christ. We could pause for a moment to pray: 'Jesus, remember me, know me by heart, for when you do I will be in Paradise.' © Fr Michael Tate; mtate@bigpond.com
