Reflection:

Who has cursed you? Bless them! Who has mistreated you? Pray for them! Who has taken something from you unfairly? Give them more! Who has been an enemy to you? Love them the way they should love you but are not. Ouch, I do not enjoy living like that. But who says we're supposed to enjoy everything we do? Jesus certainly did not enjoy his cross. The way of the cross is what separates the holy from the earthly. As Jesus says in today's Gospel reading, "If you love those who love you, big deal! Even sinners do that." We are saints -- i.e., we are different from the world because we follow Christ --in the way we treat those who do not love us: the healthy way, the compassionate way, the Christ-like way. Jesus spelled out very clearly that to be children of the Most High God, we have to be kind to the ungrateful and the wicked, just like our Divine Daddy. We have to be merciful, just like our Father in whose image we were created.

No matter what others do to us, God is good to us. When they curse us and we bless them, God blesses us, and since what he blesses becomes holy, we become -- wow! -- holy saints. When they mistreat us and we pray for them, Jesus prays for us -- for our needs and for our healing - and the Father will never say no to his Son. When they take from us unfairly and we give them more than what they're demanding, God gives us more than what we need. That's how much God loves us! Oh what joy!

Parish Finance Update

Whilst Parish finances currently look to be in a robust state following the receipt of the \$371,500 insurance payout from the fire that destroyed our Church at Kiah, the underlying annual budget for the year ended 30 July 2021 points to a deficit of around \$9,000. This deficit is driven by a combination of the marked fall in contributions (this trend has been in place for some years and has been exacerbated by the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic) and the ongoing upward pressure on costs associated with running the Parish.

The Parish Finance Committee continues to work actively to put in place a plan that returns the budget to surplus and ensures the long term financial viability of the Parish. At the current time the key focus of the Committee is on the following matters:

- 1. Continuing negotiations with the Kiah Community regarding the sale of the Parish land at Kiah upon which the Church was located.
- 2. The building of a new Sacristy in St Joseph's Church in Merimbula. The current Sacristy fails to meet any of the current standards of privacy or space. Quotes are currently being sought for this project which is strongly supported by Archbishop Prowse.
- 3. Seeking a property investment opportunity for the surplus funds. The aim of this is to secure a sustainable cash flow to ensure that the Parish budget returns to a surplus into the future.

This Parish has survived for a very lengthy period because of very generous financial contributions and other high levels of voluntary assistance from Parishioners. I would like to thank you all for your ongoing assistance and look forward to working with you as we develop the strategies to ensure that the Parish remains on a sustainable track for future generations. May God bless you all.

Ecclesiasticus 27:33-28:9

Resentment and anger, these are foul things, and both are found with the sinner. He who exacts vengeance will experience the vengeance of the Lord,

Matthew 18:21-35

Peter went up to Jesus and said, 'Lord, how often must I forgive my brother if he wrongs me? As often as seven times?' Jesus answered, 'Not seven, I tell you, but seventy-seven times.

'And so the kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who decided to settle his accounts with his servants. When the reckoning began, they brought him a man who owed ten thousand talents; but he had no means of paying, so his master gave orders that he should be sold. together with his wife and children and all his possessions, to meet the debt. At this, the servant threw himself down at his master's feet. "Give me time" he said "and I will pay the whole sum." And the servant's master felt so sorry for him that he let him go and cancelled the debt. Now as this servant went out, he happened to meet a fellow servant who owed him one hundred denarii; and he seized him by the throat and began to throttle him. "Pay what you owe me" he said. His fellow servant fell at his feet and implored him, saving, "Give me time and I will pay you." But the other would not agree; on the contrary, he had him thrown into prison till he should pay the debt.

His fellow servants were deeply distressed when they saw what had happened, and they went to their master and reported the whole affair to him. Then the master sent for him. "You wicked servant," he said "I cancelled all that debt of yours when you appealed to me. Were you not bound, then, to have pity on your fellow servant just as I had pity on you?" And in his anger the master handed him over to the torturers till he should pay all his debt. And that is how my heavenly Father will deal with you unless you each forgive your brother from your heart.'

Romans 14:7-9

The life and death of each of us has its influence on others; if we live, we live for the Lord; and if we die, we die for the Lord, so that alive or dead we belong to the Lord. This explains why Christ both died and came to life: it was so that he might be Lord both of the dead and of the living.
