**Reflection:** 14 Sunday



The questions asked by the townspeople of  
Nazareth are interesting ones. They rightly  
seek to understand the origins of Jesus'  
wisdom and power. 'Where did the man get  
all this? What is this wisdom that has been  
granted him, and these miracles that are  
worked through him?' They recognise that  
Jesus is not the source of his own authority.  
There is a greater power behind him. Their  
failure lies in the fact that they do not  
recognise the source of Jesus' power and  
authority. They do not see the presence of  
God in the words and deeds of their  
compatriot. Indeed, Jesus is designated as 'son  
of Mary', a slur on them both at a time when  
one's genealogy was traced through the line of  
the father. Jesus is astonished by the inability  
of the townspeople to look beyond what they  
are familiar with to the obvious signs of the  
kingdom of God in his actions and words.  
The kingdom of God requires the cooperation  
of people if it is to become a reality. He can do  
nothing there!

There is great debate about the relationship of  
'the brothers of the Lord' to Jesus. Some  
scholars suggest that they were in fact literal  
brothers (or half-brothers or step-brothers),  
while others scholars point out that it was  
common practice to refer to cousins and even  
more distant relations as 'brothers'. The  
Catholic Church holds that Jesus was the only  
child of Mary, the virgin mother of Christ.
