Gospel Reflection:

A small text later in the Gospel of Luke offers us a key to today's gospel. During his public ministry, Jesu says, 'Up to the time of John it was the Law and the Prophets; since then the Kingdom of God has been preached' (Luke 16:16). The baptism of Jesus marks the turning point. Today's gospel tells the story of crossing the threshold from the old order into the new. John very clearly states that despite some people's expectations, he is not the Messiah- the usher of the new order. John points beyond his own time to a future when God's Spirit is given at Baptism, and the first of such baptisms belongs to Jesus himself. Immediately after Jesus' somewhat anonymous immersion along with 'all the people', the Spirit does indeed come to Jesus and the affirming voice from heaven announces Christ's sonship. God has come among us indeed.

In Luke's gospel, Jesus is very aware of the consequences of submitting to the baptism proclaimed by John. Filled with the Holy Spirit, he goes into the desert, where he wrestles with all that he will be forced to forego in taking up his role as God's beloved Son. His resolve is firm, and he announces his mission in the synagogue at Nazareth.

Baptism is the first of the seven sacraments of the church. A sacrament is a sign through which God communicates love, life and forgiveness to us: 'Immersion in water symbolises not only death and purification, but also regeneration and renewal. Thus the two principal effects (of baptism) are purification from sins and new birth in the Holy Spirit' (*CCC* §1262).
