# Reflection 8 Sunday Exploring The Word

Luke continues with his examination of the new order ushered in by discipleship and



turns to a very personal dimension of what it means to be a follower of Christ. The 'fully trained disciple will always be like his teacher'. Jesus offers himself as a model of non-judgement. This, after all, belongs only to God. There are echoes here of last week's text: 'Be compassionate as your Father is compassionate. Do not judge and you will not be judged yourselves; grant pardon and you will be pardoned.' The disciple must recognise their own shortcomings and work tirelessly to rectify these so that what issues forth from their hearts are the good fruits that only true goodness of heart can produce.

Have you ever been the victim of someone's unfair judgement or criticism? How did this make you feel? Have you ever been too quick to judge someone else or been forced to confront your own failings? What steps did you take to make changes?

From earliest times, the church has provided an avenue to encourage the faithful to recognise and deal with our human frailty and weakness. The sacrament of reconciliation provides an opportunity to confess our failings before God, to seek his forgiveness for them and to become reconciled again in his love.

Interior repentance is a radical reorientation of our whole life, a return, a conversion to God with all our heart, an end of sin, a turning away from evil ... At the same time it entails the desire and resolution to change one's life, with hope in God's mercy and trust in the help of his grace. (The Summit)
