TURN AND LISTEN

The Gospel reading on this Australia Day weekend is timely. Following the death of John the Baptist, Jesus begins his ministry in Galilee. He calls the people to repent for the Kingdom is close at hand. We can baulk at the call to repentance, though it is life-giving. To 'repent' is to be more than sorry for sin. "Full biblical repentance means being prepared to look at one's life and one's hopes for the future in a totally new way, open and receptive to the - usually surprising - action of God" (Brendan Byrne SJ). When Jesus began his public ministry people were somewhat despairing: they understood the influence of evil spirits and the occupation of the Romans as cause for thinking that God had abandoned them. They hungered for God's presence to be powerfully manifest as it had been at the Exodus from Egypt and on their return home from Exile. However, central to the kingdom and before political and material well-being there was to be a divine claim on people's hearts. "The Kingdom was, then, about the gathering of a renewed and transformed Israel – a community in which God could truly dwell ('Emmanuel'). So, as his first public act, Jesus begins to gather this renewed Israel by calling the first four of those who, later to become the Twelve, will be the pillars of the People of God" (Byrne). As in the time of Jesus, so now Australians can be discouraged by all manner of happenings. Where is God? God is not in the habit of intervening and preventing what life throws up but rather supporting and reassuring at all times. Surely the spontaneous and gratifying community spirit in the wake of recent natural disasters affirms the movement of God's Spirit? What might we and our community be like if in the midst of 'the ordinary' and not just the

extraordinary we, like the fishermen, had an openness to God's call? Perhaps we need to realign our perspective, "to look at one's life and one's hopes for the future in a totally new way, open and receptive to the - usually surprising - action of God." Before presuming to address any number of situations in our lives and nation (e.g. climate change and the ongoing significance of Australia Day), we should turn to and listen to the one who says, "Follow me".
