WE ARE INTERRELATED

We are formed in community. Today's Gospel instructs the early Church about the attitudes and structures necessary to deal with "moral lapses, dissensions and other failings that inevitably occur in a community still 'on the way' to the perfection of the Kingdom" (Brendan Byrne SJ). The hope is that the process will be restorative and private, though it could become punitive and public and even result in excommunication. To decide so is a very serious matter as the power of 'binding and loosing' has divine ratification. While we are nurtured in the family of faith or the Church, the first and most formative community is that of our natural family. Culture passes by way of the family. We develop our initial sense of self-worth and communal engagement in and through our family. Today we honour all dads and those other men who have had a fatherly role in our journey. To varying degrees we are "a chip off the old block". Most give thanks for nurture received from their dads, others are still coming to terms with painful pasts. The other morning while out jogging, I noticed a dad who had walked his young son to school and then said to him, "Give me a hug and a kiss". Having done so, his dad told him, "Off you go and have a good day." Both were very blessed, and so was I to chance upon them. On the other hand, when relationships go awry we are also impacted. Andy Hamilton SJ has noted that Pope Francis's September prayer intention is for a just and respectful sharing of the world's resources. Hamilton points out that "because the welfare of nations is interrelated" we must address the corona virus together. Anything less will especially impact developing nations and "be reflected in massive poverty and hunger, and this in turn leads to the destruction of the environment." The same notion of interrelationship is to the fore in this year's Social

Justice Statement 'To Live Life to the Full – Mental Health in Australia Today' (go to socialjustice.catholic.org.au). The Bishops observe that "our society tends to draw away from, or to push away, those who confront us with our frailties or limitations" which is "completely at odds with the story of Jesus" who "takes on the frailty of the human condition" and "draws near to those who are sick or who have disabilities, those who are marginalised or despised". Again, **Child Protection Week (6 – 11 September)** reminds us of our duty of care for young people. **It is true: no one is an island**, **we are all in need and our actions affect others.** Might our awareness of this be manifest in our self-respect and in our thoughts, words and deeds. A tall order but one that in response to the movement of the Holy Spirit seeks to affirm, to connect and to nurture, as Jesus did and as were the early Church called to do. Fr John
