Not Fair but Very Generous

Have you sat at traffic lights behind a car with personalised number plates and smiled at their ingenuity? Have you thought of creating your own? If I was so inclined and owned a Porsche or a Ferrari, perhaps I might go for 'NV', that is, 'ENVY', "a feeling of discontented or resentful longing aroused by someone else's possessions, qualities, or luck." Why do we handle many being worse off, but baulk at some being advantaged? In today's Gospel, God's generosity is to the fore. The vineyard owner hires workers for his vineyard. However the late comers receive as much as the fellows who have worked hard all day in the sun. That is not fair. No, it's not but that's the point: God's ways are not our ways (cf. First Reading from Isaiah). We presume they should be. We subscribe to the justice principle of more for more and less for less. This principle "regulates such vital areas of social behaviour as honest trade and fair employment . . . [but] God does not deal with humanity according to fairness. He deals with us according to love" (James J Gaffney). God gives what God is: love. "That is what God is doing in Jesus ministry – giving the tax collectors and prostitutes an equal share with the righteous in his kingdom. Obviously, the parable is not a lesson about labor relations!" (Reginald H Fuller). The owner of the vineyard is not fair but he is very generous and no one misses out. "His standards are not standards of fairness. But neither are they below those standards. Rather they are above standards of fairness. The employer gives what is certainly not deserved. Good men are puzzled and annoyed. And well they might be, for by ordinary decent human standards the employer's behaviour is indefensible. And, that, of course, is the point. His ways are higher than their ways. His thoughts are much higher than their thoughts" (Gaffney). We cannot earn God's love. We can only be open to its nurturing, mindful that it is its' own reward and the response

of each builds up the whole. As a cook, it is doubtful that a recipe would constrain God. Rather, a dash there; that to be warmed over but not heated through; a sprinkle of that, no two; a big dollop of that and much less of that. Each action and its interaction contributes to the whole, to the reign of God. Under God's grace as St Mary MacKillop (1888) said: "Do what you can with the means at your disposal and leave all the rest calmly to God."
