IN GRATITUDE

Each week we have a Gospel reading. We have heard the readings before and to that extent we think we are across But are we always aware of the context of the Gospel reading? Knowing the context can enhance our appreciation of the text. Today's Gospel is from Matthew 21. After his Galilean ministry, Jesus has journeyed to Jerusalem. His clash with the religious authorities is coming to a head. He has turned over the moneychangers tables at the Temple (Matt 21:12). He is fired up. So next day when confronted by the chief priests and elders about the justification for his behaviour, "his response is swift, forceful, and confronting, drawing on the parable of the two sons (Matt 21:28-32), and then the parable of the wicked tenants. . . . It is not simply that the tenants have not delivered the produce at the time of harvesting: they have had multiple opportunities to respond positively to the legitimate invitations of three servants, then a larger delegation, all of whom are either beaten, killed or stoned. It is clear that Jesus is recounting the story of how Israel has responded to God's messengers, not just the prophets of old, but most importantly, John the Baptist and Jesus himself" (Fr Chris Monaghan CP). After rejecting the overtures of the owner's son and heir, the owner of the vineyard gives it to others. This comment reflects 'a reading back' into the life of Jesus of the early Church's growth amongst the Gentiles. Little wonder that the chief priests knew that Jesus had them in his sights and they wanted to do away with him: trouble-maker from up north as they saw him! And yet the foreboding doom is countered by the mention of the rejected stone that becomes the keystone. Therein is perhaps the issue for us: the compassion of God revealed in Jesus can lull us into a complacency: he is my saviour and so what need have I

to worry? Rather than being smug, perhaps we would do well to ask, "What is the fruit we have been asked to bear and haven't? What are the invitations that we have rejected? It is not just Israel's story: it is our story too, the church's story, and the story of our own families and institutions" (ibid). Without trivialising the Gospel, perhaps we might begin with the following checklist: Who can I help today? What am I grateful for today? Do I have time for at least a 'Hello God' each day? Do I rejoice in the well-being of physical exercise each day? Do I eat some good food each day? What am I looking forward to? When did I last smile? When did I last have a good laugh?
