A LIVING FAITH

On leaving St Christopher's after a funeral, an old gentleman said that he could not believe it. "Believe what?" I asked. "Believe that I had worked with John for eighteen years and never once heard him mention that he had been a Lancaster pilot for over thirty missions with Bomber Command!" There is so much that we do not know about one another. After nearly three years with his followers, Jesus asks them, "Who do people say I am?" Then, very personally, "Who do you say I am?" Peter answers, "You are the Christ [or the long-awaited Messiah]." However,

Peter is admonished for his misunderstanding of the fate of the Messiah who will suffer and die. For Peter to suggest otherwise ("to remonstrate with him") is "to play Satan's game, namely to frustrate God's gift of life to the world through the cross of Jesus. It will be by taking the road to death that Jesus will become the instrument of life" (Brendan Byrne). We answer who Jesus is for us by the lives we lead (Second Reading). We seek the assistance of the Holy Spirit in doing so. We call this 'discernment' (see attached dot points of Fr Richard Leonard SJ). Communal discernment is just that, 'communal'. Such discernment has occurred in the lead-up to the Plenary Council. It will underpin the recommendations arising from the meetings of the Plenary Council. Pope Francis refers to this ancient process as 'synodality' or 'walking together'. Indeed, the 2023 Synod or gathering of representatives of the 1.2 billion Catholics is on 'Synodality'. We are all in this as the attached recent talk of Archbishop Christopher on Synodality makes clear. Communal discernment is to listen for the movement of the Spirit in community. It is not a numbers game (the parliamentary model) but a respectful dialogue in which the contributions of all lead to an outcome which all can live with gracefully, as Archbishop Francis Carroll insisted at our 1989 Archdiocesan Synod.

Pope Francis has referred to our times not as a changing era but a change of era. What was off the table previously needs reconsideration for many. How do you address issues of governance and ordained ministry when the cultural norm is about the equality of men and women while the Church insists on their difference and complimentarity? How do you speak into the current age with an act-centred morality when a relationship appropriate paradigm is normative? How can you listen to others if you insist on a 'sacred-secular' divide rather than a faith and reason perspective which affirms a consistent ethic of life founded in an 'integral ecology' of respect for oneself, others and creation in which God's Spirit is present and active? Conversely, can you "live life to the full" (Jn 10:10) and not identify with and contribute to the common good? Do not our joys and sorrows call for a ritual engagement with the transcendent manifest in the immanent? To see and act with awareness of the Word having become flesh, of the world being "charged with the grandeur of God" (Gerard Manly Hopkins), all is transformed. "You cannot help be but both happy and holy... all who look at the world with respect, even if they are not formally religious, are en Cristo, or in Christ. For them as Thomas Merton says, "the gate of heaven is everywhere" because of their freedom to respect what is right in front of them. . . When Jesus spoke the words "This is my Body," I believe he was speaking not just about the bread right in front of him, but about the whole universe, about everything that is physical, material yet also spirit-filled" (Richard Rohr). Communal discernment in the name of Church is inclusive or it is not true to the purpose of religion, as 're-ligio', literally means ' to re-ligament' or 'to reconnect'. To take up our cross might well be to look a second time or to re-spect, and then, true to our living tradition and the call of the Spirit to step out in faith and courage. "Tradition is the living faith of the dead; traditionalism is the dead faith of the living" (Jaorslav Pelikan) Fr John
