To do this we must also pay the everyday running costs of electricity, rates, salaries, insurances etc. and attend to the maintenance of our church and other buildings for future generations. Supporting our parish and clergy is like supporting your own family, the spiritual family. Stepping away from helping our parish family, for whatever reason; the scandals, hierarchy, or whatever; I think it's like running away from our own responsibilities.

There are different ways of contributing, many parishioners now give their weekly donation electronically: -

These forms of giving will ensure some certainty for the Parish Finance Committee to plan and budget our expenses.

Now, that we have moved into one collection, what we receive on parish Tap&Go machine is divided on a 65/35 ratio, that is 65 percent is set apart for the upkeep of the parish and 35 percent to support the clergy.

The comment was made at one of our clergy gatherings that, if each person coming to our parishes were to give the extra cost of couple of coffees on top of their regular giving we could double the giving at our parishes overnight. It's that easy. Why not give it a go? You get less caffeine and the Parish benefits too. I earnestly request all our parishioners to please join, if you are not already, in the parish planned giving programme and existing planned givers please update your details.
