DIVINE AND HUMAN FAMILY

This is a time when families gather. My brother Mel travelled to Glasgow, Scotland for Christmas and the birth of his grandchild. This can also be a time of heightened family tensions. While 'blood might be thicker than water', the Readings today compare and contrast two different attitudes to families. Our Second Reading commends a traditional understanding of family. However, the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke present a different picture. Jesus would have it that family ties can be a hindrance to following Jesus! After all, Jesus did say that one cannot be a disciple without 'hating' one's family members. While the Semitic idiom uses 'love' and 'hate' to show a preference, the ambiguity remains. This ambiguity is played out in today's Gospel. We hear Mary express her displeasure after finding Jesus in the Temple — "See how worried your father and I have been looking for you." Jesus response being about his Father's business highlights the ambiguity. "On Mary's lips, 'father' refers to her husband, Joseph. But Jesus is speaking of his Father in heaven. Into their tranquil family life bursts a sharp reminder of his true status as unique Son of God and of the destiny —the 'Father's 'business' — to which they are going to have to surrender him" (Brendan Byrne). This surrender which will culminate at the cross is the 'sword' that will pierce the heart of Mary, as Simeon had prophesied (2:35). The mission of Jesus places him above any familial relationship for the sake of bringing the entire human 'family' back into relationship with his Father. Yet Jesus uses familial images when instructing us to pray, 'Our Father . . .' (Matt 6:9-13; Luke 11:2-40) and Paul says the Spirit is poured into our hearts that we might cry

'Abba, Father' (Rmns 8:15; Gal 4:6). Jesus said that his family are those who hear the word of God and keep it (Luke 8:21). And being drawn in to the dignity of his divine family is foundational to the dignity of all families. And therein lies the rub for "growing into Christian adulthood is perhaps no easier than growing into human adulthood and no less immune to the trials all growth entails. Each of us is called to discover and 'be about' our Father's business in our unique way" (ibid).
