FAITH IN ACTION – THE GREATER GOOD

"You don't get it, do you? You are far from understanding what I am about, and what it means to follow me." This might well have been the response of Jesus to his disciples who rebuked someone for acting in Jesus' name. "Jesus does not mind his name being used by another for a good purpose . . . The disciples, on the other hand, are . . . more concerned about an outsider's use of what they see as their own prerogative and possession . . . This is not to play down the importance of being associates of Jesus. It is simply to insist that what is supremely important about such belonging is preparedness for costly service rather than resting on privilege and power" (Brendan Byrne). These reflections are pertinent as our Archdiocese today celebrates 'Respect Life Sunday' and the universal Church celebrates 'World Migrant and Refugee Sunday'. The needs of those who have fled their homeland, those granted migrant status and those innocent in the womb and those approaching the end of life have claims on us, all of us. Indeed, the church joins with people of all religious faiths and none to uphold the dignity all. This is more often but not always seen in the rule of law. If people are proposing positions at law contrary to Catholic teaching, what should be done? In the first instance, as is one's right in conscience and at law, speak out. In commenting on Kamala Harris's insistence on restoring the right in conscience for US women to seek abortion and Donald Trump's call for the deportation of millions of refugees, Pope Francis insists: "Both [Harris and Trump] are against life." What should

voters in the US [and here] do? Mindful that we live in democracies and not theocracies, the Catholic Bishops of England and Wales in 1996 and since have stated that voters could chose the greater of two goods rather than the lesser of two evils: "The question must be: can an elector be confident that the person for whom he or she is voting is the best of those offering themselves . . . This consideration will discourage [choosing] solely on the basis of one policy issue, even where the attitudes of a candidate on such an issue are at variance with Catholic teaching."
