GOOD AND EVIL ARE OPPOSITES

God is love. Tick. Then how come to sin or "blaspheme against the Holy Spirit" cannot be forgiven? Some context first. Today's Gospel has Jesus face misunderstanding from both his family and from the scribes. While the crowds are attracted to him, the scribes claim that his miracles are because he is in league with evil. "The ancient world attributed to demonic possession many pathological human conditions that modern medicine would assign to natural causes. This made Jesus' healing activity, interpreted in a hostile sense, open to the accusation that he expels demons in alliance with demonic power. In effect they are accusing him of sorcery, a capital offence at the time" (Brendan Byrne). However, as we have noted before, Mark's Gospel has John the Baptist speak of Jesus as the more powerful or stronger one (Mk 1:7). Jesus shows himself to be the more powerful or stronger one who "through his exorcisms, has come to bind up the Strong man – Satan – and "burgle" his house in the sense of reclaiming human beings for the freedom of God's Rule" (ibid). Jesus then undermines the logic of the scribes in pointing out that a divided house cannot stand. Indeed, to claim that his miracles are through "through the prince of demons is tantamount to

identifying the Spirit of God with the demonic world. Whereas all other blasphemies may in due course find forgiveness, such a blasphemy is unforgivable" . . . (Those who) identify his activity with what is in fact its diametric opposite place themselves outside the scope of that forgiveness" (Ibid). Further, in saying that his disciples are his "brother, sister and mother", is not a put-down of his natural family but rather an affirmation of the growing family of faith, that is, those who do the will of God. The more powerful or stronger one seeks to bring all into the family of faith. And so in our First Reading, we understand that "the Son (Jesus) of the New Eve (Mary) will crush the demonic world represented by the serpent" (ibid). In our Second Reading Paul encourages the people of Corinth to persevere under God's grace, giving thanks in the founded hope of "an everlasting home not made with human hands". We walk in the knowledge of the family of faith that the stronger one has come to set us free so that we "might have life and have it to the full" (Jn 10:10).
