## **PEOPLE OF HOPE**

Following our 30 October discernment night for the renewal of our Parish Pastoral Council, I am pleased to announce that I will be joined in the same by: Margaret Bekema, Mark Calixterio, Jerome Hitchings, Geoff Joy, Julie Long, Glenn Roff, Rob Shiner and a yet to be nominated representative from each of our parish schools, Holy Trinity, Curtin and Ss Peter and Paul, Garran. These parishioners will provide a representative group for your incoming Parish Priest, Fr James Antony to further the pastoral good of the parish. On Wednesday evening the Parish Pastoral Council met with our parish renewal facilitator, Phil(omena) Billington. The meeting considered how members of the Council might liaise with and support various ministries and groups of the parish. An integral and supportive approach is the aim. Next week I will be emailing a personal welcome to those parishioners who during our parish renewal nominated for an existing ministry or group or new one. Training and formation will occur in the New Year. However, on the First Sunday of Advent, the first Sunday of the Church's year, Saturday-Sunday, 30 November-1 December we will have a simple commissioning of existing and new volunteers for any and all ministries and groups. As with our parish renewal and with all activities of the parish, we hold them up in prayer at the weekend Eucharist, the 'source and summit' of our lives. Today's Gospel sees Jesus respond to the act of total trust of the widow who put into the temple treasury all she had. On the one hand, it can be interpreted as an instance of the religious law, as interpreted by the scribes, draining 'little ones' of all they had. In a wider context, this scene is followed by Jesus' prophecy of the Temple's destruction. "The function of atonement associated with it [the Temple] will soon be taken over once and for

all by the shedding of Jesus' own blood (Mark 10:45; 14:24). The scene then becomes a warning against the way in which religion, falsely interpreted and promoted, can serve to oppress rather than liberate the poor and vulnerable, for whose life Christ shed his blood on the cross" (Brendan Byrne). The people of the US have selected Donald Trump as President. Cardinal Pietro Parolin, Vatican Secretary of State echoed the thoughts of many when he said in an interview "that he must be the president of the entire country and thus, overcome the polarization that has occurred, which has been very, very clearly felt in this time" (ANSA). Moving forward, we note that Pope Francis has designated 2025 as a Jubilee Year of Hope with the theme 'Pilgrims of Hope'. He insists: "We must fan the flame of hope that has been given us, and help everyone to gain new strength and certainty by looking to the future with an open spirit, a trusting heart and far-sighted vision." Like the widows in our First Reading and the Gospel, might we people of hope seeking in the midst of all challenges to uphold goodness, beauty and truth.

EVER THOUGHT OF BECOMING CATHOLIC? If so, Fr John and some parishioners invite you to join them 7:00 - 8:30pm, this Monday, 11 November, in the Parish Centre adjacent to Holy Trinity Church. The invitation is to meet regularly thereafter and journey to reception into the Church next Easter. Join others to reflect on the teaching and practice of the Catholic faith and whether you might want to come into the Catholic Church or complete your sacramental initiation. All are welcome.
