TRUSTING PRIORITIES

Last week we heard Jesus reinforce God's original design for a permanent marital commitment between man and woman. Today there is an equally strong insistence on a detached attitude to wealth and the perceived security and freedom it offers. Hang on, last week with marriage we also noted the early Church understood that the end would be very soon, and besides people now live much longer and insist on individual freedom in starting again following a mistake. Besides, with reference to today's Gospel, we cannot all go around like a St Francis of Assisi or Mother Teresa. We have responsibilities to our loved ones and an obligation to develop our God-given gifts. Radical detachment is all very well for a few but it will never cut it in the mainstream. Then how do we respond to today's Gospel? Perhaps a clue is found in the parallel starkness of Luke's Gospel where Jesus insists that a disciple must 'hate' one's "father and mother, wife and children" (Lk 14:26-30). The more correct translation would be 'prefer' rather than 'hate'. The rich young man who approached Jesus did want eternal life. He maintained outward observance of the law. However, his attachment to his wealth was such that he preferred its' perceived security. He could not have faith or trust in the call of Jesus, personal as it was. Nevertheless, he walked away 'sad' as "he knows he is declining something that would have given him that fulfilment for which, at the deepest part of his person, it seems he was longing" (Brendan Byrne). The statement of Jesus about a camel passing through the eye of a needle is still very apt. In a materially prosperous society it is difficult not to develop an unholy (or misplaced) attachment to money and material goods as the measure of well-being. "Jesus hardly required literal abandonment of possessions from all his followers. However, all are called to a freedom from the kind of attachment to wealth that shows distrust of the God proclaimed by Jesus: One who can be trusted absolutely to bestow (eternal) life on those who follow Jesus' way" (ibid). These reflections are very fitting for this weekend's renewal of parish 'Ministries of Leadership and Governance'. We are being asked to consider sharing our gifts and some of our precious time through membership of the mandated Parish Pastoral Council or Parish Finance Council, or as part of a desired Parish Communications Team or voluntary assistance with parish grounds and buildings maintenance. As with all ministries in the Church the aim is to further the reign of God in our midst.
