GOD'S DESIRE FOR INTIMACY

'Intimacy' is described online as "a close, familiar, and usually affectionate or loving personal raltionship with another person or group." Today's Gospel reading, the fourth in sequence from John 6, addresses God's desire for intimacy with us. The reading situates the "Bread of Life" discourse within the 'Wisdom' or sapiential tradition of the Old Testament and the Eucharistic experience of the Christian community. In our First Reading from the Book of Proverbs, 'Lady Wisdom' invites people to a feast. "The "feast" is the good teaching (wisdom) the Book of Proverbs wishes to commend. "Eating" this "feast" is the way to life" (Brendan Byrne). Fast forward to Jesus and his claim to be the "Bread of Life". People take offence to the literal interpretation of eating his flesh and drinking his blood; it sounds like cannibalism. Indeed, the early Christians in Rome were accused of being cannibals! However, it is not to be taken literally. Rather we access the revelation of divine life "by grasping in faith (= "eating") that revelation of

divine love" (ibid). The Second Vatican Council rediscovered and emphasised that at every Mass there is a bringing together of the Wisdom or sapiential tradition and the sacramental meanings. The life-giving Liturgy of the Word and the "food" and "drink" in the Liturgy of the Eucharist call for a faith response to Jesus, revelation of the Father's love as "Bread of Life". Partaking of the liturgy in faith we experience God is with us, and for this we offer thanksgiving, the meaning of 'Eucharist'. While the Eucharist is 'source and summit' of our lives, we need to understand that God seeks intimacy with us in all aspects of our lives. Indeed, "the ordinary is made sacred. A Christian life is one in which God is discovered again and again in daily experiences. Food, friendship, sport, family, tiredness and even a dreary journey to work on public transport are all places where God can be encountered. God takes the bread and wine of ordinary life and makes them holy. What might look like another day of work or study is actually filled with the presence of Christ: (Michael McGirr).
