OPENNESS TO AND ENGAGEMENT WITH ALL

Last week's Gospel saw Peter correctly identify Jesus as 'the Messiah'. Today we see the disciples struggling to reconcile their conventional understanding of the Messiah - synonymous with power and prestige - and Jesus telling them that he will be betrayed and put to death. Indicative of their hearing but not listening is Jesus' rebuke for their squabbling about presumed places of honour. He rubs it in, if you will, with reference to a child. The comments of two Scripture scholars are noteworthy. John J. Pilch notes: "By asking the disciples to extend hospitality ("to welcome") a child, a creature of low status in their culture, Jesus further shames these grown men. Hospitality is extended to complete strangers to guarantee safe transit in unfamiliar and hostile territory. To extend hospitality to children ("to welcome them") would be a laugh to everyone else in the culture. Further, though guests are not expected to reciprocate hospitality, they are expected to broadcast the kindness of the host far and wide, thus expanding his honourable reputation. Unpredictable children couldn't be counted upon, so why bother?" Indeed, according to Australian Jesuit and Scripture scholar Brendan Byrne SJ, in hugging the child, Jesus "shows more powerfully than any word could express the preciousness of each and every human life, no matter how small, how insignificant, in the sight of God. We are all - in our 'littleness' - hugged by Jesus in this moment." Returning from his recent visit to South-East Asia and Oceania, Pope Francis said that the Church was still too Eurocentric or Western. Perhaps relative material well-being, religious indifference and an unprecedented stress on the individual have taken the edge off our shared experience of faith? Contrast this with the communal commitment of the materially impoverished who are often subject to prejudice if not persecution for their beliefs. Today we celebrate the First Communion of a

number of young parishioners. With the ongoing support and example of their parents, may they grow to better appreciate, receive often and share this greatest of all gifts. *"If we receive the Eucharist worthily, we become what we receive" (St Augustine).* How might we all be a Eucharistic people in response to the September prayer intention of Pope Francis for the linked "cry of the earth and cry of the poor"? Faith is not ethereal. It is celebrated and lived in particular times and places. *Fr John*
