TO SEE AND TO ACT

Crime thrillers will often have a clue or twist hidden in plain sight. Such is present in today's Gospel. Jesus' journey to Jerusalem began with his cure of the blind man at Bethsaida (8:22-26). It concludes in today's reading with Jesus' cure of the blind man as he leaves Jericho, the last town before Jerusalem. "The arrangement suggests an intention on the part of the Evangelist to make the physical blindness of the two men Jesus heals a symbol of the spiritual blindness of the disciples, which, as we have noted again and again, is the chief focus of Jesus' activity on the journey to Jerusalem" (Brendan Byrne). Nonetheless, it is only after his death and resurrection and the sufferings in their own lives that the disciples will begin to understand and identify with "the mystery of the world's pain and suffering in the person of Jesus" (ibid). Back to the blind man. He is very shrewd. How can he 'force' Jesus, the passing faith healer to cure him? He shouts "Son of David, have mercy on me!" In acknowledging Jesus as 'Son of David' the blind man is identifying Jesus as the Messiah, whatever about the differing understandings of the title. Moreover, he seeks mercy from Jesus. In that culture was understood as a willingness to pay personal debts. He believes that Jesus can pay the debt owed for his being blind. By repeating this statement over and over, it would be very difficult for Jesus to accept either honorific title and not respond. He cures the blind man. He does so in response to being identified as of the line of (King) David, but as one who serves. Jesus intercedes like a servant with the God of Israel to obtain restoration of the man's sight. In turn the former blind man follows and identifies with "Jesus as his successful broker

with the patron-God of Israel who does not turn a deaf ear to the requests of a humble subject (John J PIIch). We too are called to see anew, to align our understanding with God's vision. Psychotherapist Victor E Frankl comments: "Like the healthy eye which does not see itself, we, too, function best when we are overlooking and forgetting ourselves, by giving of ourselves. Forgetting myself makes for sensitivity, and giving myself, for creativity. By virtue of the self–transcendence of human existence we are beings in search of meaning." To seek present and eternal meaning is the journey of transformation in Christ. How sad then to be so self-focused as to be blind to the meaning of life?
