TRANSFIGURATION FOR THE JOURNEY

Most parishes have a saint as their patron. Think St Francis of Assisi, St Patrick's, St Cecilia's, etc. Our parish is named after an experience, the Transfiguration. Today we celebrate our parish feast day, anticipating Tuesday's 6 August celebration of the universal Church. On the mountain Jesus in the presence of his beloved disciples, Peter, James and John, undergoes a 'metamorphosis', manifest in the whiteness of his garments. In Jewish literature whiteness refers to the heavenly realm, "while the Greek term morphe refers to the way in which the inner most being of a person displays itself outwardly" (Brendan Byrne). In line with Moses and Elijah, with whom Jesus is seen to be conversing, and the hopes of the people of Old Covenant, the fullness of the glory of God is manifest in Jesus. Peter is overcome and wants to stay with the experience, failing to listen to the assertion of Jesus that he must suffer, die and rise again. The issue the disciples hereafter struggle with is how can the beloved Son of God be destined to die? "The transfiguration, then, is not simply a revelation of Jesus' divine status; it is a revelation of a profound mystery

lying at the heart of the Gospel: God's costly personal involvement in the evil of the world . . . Jesus will enter most deeply into the pain and suffering of the world to set it free (10:45)" (ibid). Having become one with us, we are never far from the closeness of God whether it be in moments of sublime awareness, the celebration of the sacraments or particular moments every day. Indeed, the Transfiguration speaks not of the remoteness but the closeness of God in the "thinness" of the divide between the human and the divine. Transfiguration Parish is now 30 years old. Holy Trinity Church was blessed and opened 50 years ago. Building on the legacy of faith that is ours to nurture, our parish is undergoing a time of renewal. Last weekend we shared about what we value about our parish. We continue our reflections this weekend. Our aim is to listen, not to presume in good faith as did Peter as to where the Spirit is moving. It is our experience of 'synodality'. Come, Holy Spirit so that we might follow as faithful disciples. Fr John
