CALLED IN INTIMACY AND IN COMMUNAL DISCERNMENT

During the week I recall conversations concerning domestic violence, a house sale following divorce, practical support for a single mum and blended families. You would have had similar conversations if not personal experiences or are close to people who have. `Today's Gospel therefore seems at odds with contemporary realities. Mark espouses a radical fidelity in married life (and will call for the same in matters of wealth). While Jesus did rule out divorce and remarriage, "we must take into account that life expectancy in the ancient world was less than half that prevailing in developed Western societies today. Moreover, Jesus and the early community lived in expectation that the world as presently constituted was soon – perhaps in the very same generation – going to pass away (cf. Mark 9:1). . . . Moreover, the reality is that people make mistakes and relationships fail – something which longer life span and the high premium currently placed upon personal freedom and development make more prevalent. The Church has to find a way to help people grow through failure and find in it an experience of grace and deepened knowledge of God" (Brendan Byrne). At the same the Church must uphold the original design of God for the social institution of marriage in which "companionship, friendship and mutual recognition in love . . . should surround sexual union." Here the ministry of the Marriage Tribunal assists folk to determine the status of their marriage and perhaps establish their freedom to enter a union blessed by the Church. Having being Director of the Marriage Tribunal and with occasional involvement still, I can share first-hand experience of the value of this ministry. You might like to continue reflecting on the call of marriage and indeed the priesthood and religious life by reading the engaging article, "Affectivity and the Eucharist", by Fr Timothy Radcliffe OP, former Dominican Master, author, recent visitor to Canberra and retreat facilitator for members of the Synod on Synodality. Copies are available at the exits. So too is a 'Blessing for Pets', mindful that Friday, 4 October was the Feast of St Francis of Assisi, patron of creation and animals. Internationally, the Second Assembly of the 16th Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops (2-27 October) will bring together 368 bishops, priests, religious and lay people from around the world. About fifty women will be voting members and there will be 90 non-voting members. As well, Pope Francis has invited 16 representatives of non-Catholic Christian faiths. Locally, we pray for the Synod and for our parish representatives at the 18-20 October Archdiocesan Assembly: Melissa Bray, John Eyers, Catherine Grinsell-Jones, Jerome Hitchings, Kim Hoffmeier, Geoff Joy and myself. Our parish renewal continues this weekend as we seek the guidance of the Holy Spirit and perhaps personal commitment in the area of 'Pastoral Care and Outreach'.
