**Fr Dom's Gospel Reflection:** Jesus arrives in his hometown where his own faith had been nurtured. And he arrives with the disciples—men whose faith has been nurtured by Jesus and have now made their home with him. How had his own town lost their faith in God? Perhaps Jesus grew up in a place devoid of faith? Jesus is rejected not because of anything he is actually doing but because those who are judging him seek to prop up what they want to believe at his expense. They seem blinded by pride and unable to see what Jesus is offering. They are also dismissive of the sincerity of Jesus' message that should shine through on its own merits, but they are unable to identify with this call. They questioned the very nature of the person that Jesus was and began to build a picture of a person that is just one problem after another; he became a compilation of faults, reflecting their own nature. People, indigenous to Jesus' town, did not identify with someone who offered wisdom and performed miracles. When we do not identify with a person it guarantees that you are blind to their nature and cannot see how similar they are to you and instead see a person that can only be rejected.

“The problem is not feeding the poor, or clothing the naked, or visiting the sick, but rather recognizing that the poor, the naked, the sick, prisoners, and the homeless have the dignity to sit at our table, to feel ‘at home’ among us, to feel part of a family. This is the sign that the Kingdom of Heaven is in our midst” (Pope Francis, *Let us Dream: the Path to a Better Future*, p. 113).


May our hands reach out to those
