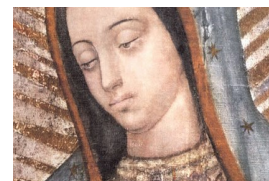

Fr Dom's Gospel Message:

Notice that when the rich man asks Jesus what can he do to inherit eternal life, he almost asks what can he do to earn eternal life? In Jesus' time there was a belief that rich people lived a life that was full of God's blessings, so if the rich were not assured of being saved then there was great doubt about how anybody else could be saved. It becomes apparent that the rich man cannot actually earn eternal life...not with money, instead he has to work for it in a very different, unfamiliar way, that requires him to leave brother, sister, father, and land for the sake of Jesus and the spread of the Gospel. This is really all about discipleship and the mercy of God. It is through the mercy of God that we can be saved and become true disciples. The life that the disciples live is far apart from the life of the rich man and it is unmistakably the apostles who have wealth in heaven. Jesus is asking the rich man to follow him, but what he is really saying is, sell everything and come and 'BE' with me. He is saying, no longer follow at a distance, come and live with me. The true treasure is the vine of eternal life, the very thing that Solomon was praying for in the First Reading.

Pope Francis' Message for Mission Sunday 2024

Dear brothers and sisters!

The theme I have chosen for this year's World Mission Day is taken from the Gospel parable of the wedding banquet (cf. *Mt22:1-14*). After the guests refused his invitation, the king, the main character in the story, tells his servants: "Go therefore to the thoroughfares, and invite to the marriage feast as many as you find" (v. 9). Reflecting on this key passage in the context of the parable and of Jesus' own life, we can discern several important aspects of evangelization. These appear particularly timely for all of us, as missionary disciples of Christ, during this final stage of the synodal journey that, in the words of its motto, "*Communion, Participation, Mission*", seeks to refocus the Church on her primary task, which is the preaching of the Gospel in today's world.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark
Jesus was setting out on a journey when a man ran

life?' Jesus said to him, 'Why do you call me good?
No one is good but God alone. You know the com-
mandments: You must not kill; You must not com-
mit adultery; You must not steal; You must not
bring false witness; You must not defraud; Honour
your father and mother.' And he said to him,
'Master, I have kept all these from my earliest
days.' Jesus looked steadily at him and loved him,
and he said, 'There is one thing you lack. Go and
sell everything you own and give the money to the
poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then
come, follow me.' But his face fell at these words
and he went away sad, for he was a man of great
wealth.

Jesus looked round and said to his disciples, 'How
hard it is for those who have riches to enter the
kingdom of God!' The disciples were astounded by
these words, but Jesus insisted, 'My children,' he
said to them, 'how hard it is to enter the kingdom
of God! It is easier for a camel to pass through the
eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the
kingdom of God.' They were more astonished than
ever. 'In that case' they said to one another, 'who
can be saved?' Jesus gazed at them. 'For men' he
said, 'it is impossible, but not for God: because eve-
rything is possible for God.'

Peter took this up. 'What about us?' he asked him.
'We have left everything and followed you.' Jesus
said, 'I tell you solemnly, there is no one who has
left house, brothers, sisters, father, children or land
for my sake and for the sake of the gospel who will
not be repaid a hundred times over, houses, broth-
ers, sisters, mothers, children and land – not with-
out persecutions – now in this present time and, in
the world to come, eternal life.'
