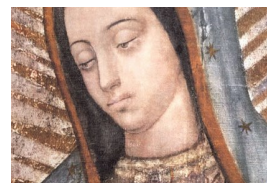

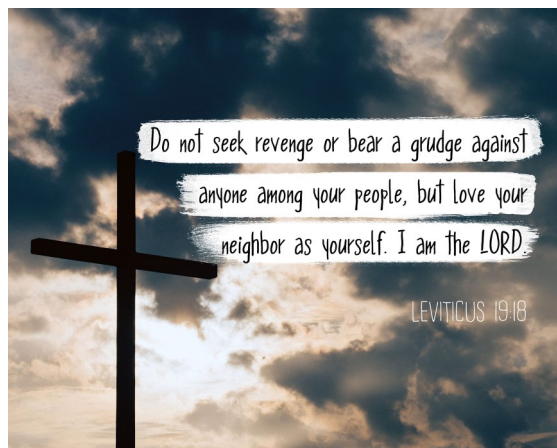

Adoration is held every Wednesday from 3 – 4pm in the 'Sisters of Mercy Chapel,' West Wyalong, followed by the Sacrament of **Reconciliation** until 5pm.

Fr Dom's Gospel Message: In the First Reading Moses speaks about the Spirit of the Ten Commandments, which he has just reminded God's people of in the earlier Chapter. Jesus quotes this Book when he says, "Listen, Israel...you must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all you soul, with all you mind and with all your strength...." Then, he quotes the Book of Leviticus when he says, "You must love your neighbour as yourself" (19: 18) and ties the two passages together, spelling it out for them. By answering in this way, Jesus demonstrates a complete understanding of the Law and positions himself as being an authority over the Law, like Moses. Jesus also demonstrates that God is the only 'God alone' who, therefore, must be God over all the other peoples of the world. This suggests that one's own neighbour does not have to be Jewish, even though they may not know our God. The scribe admits that these two are, "far more important than any holocaust or sacrifice" because he knows that God's moral laws are greater than the sacrificial laws of the Temple. We know that Jesus is the new Temple and the eternal Sacrifice: he fulfills the Law and the Prophets.

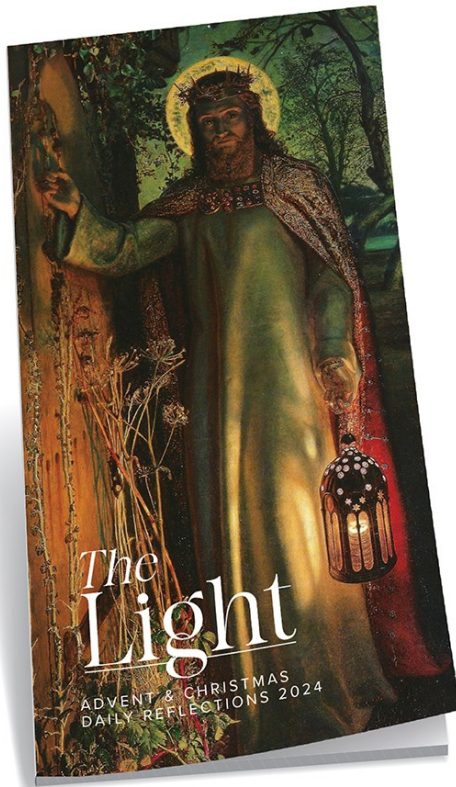

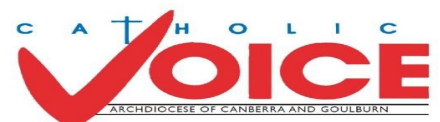

It follows, then, that his power to save is utterly certain, since he is living for ever to intercede for all who come to God through him.

To suit us, the ideal high priest would have to be holy, innocent and uncontaminated, be-

yond the influence of sinners, and raised up above the heavens; one who would not need to offer sacrifices every day, as the other high priests do for their own sins and then for those of the people, because he has done this once and for all by offering himself. The Law appoints high priests who are men subject to weakness; but the promise on oath, which came after the Law, appointed the Son who is made perfect for ever.
