Fr Dom's Gospel Message: The reading from Daniel demonstrates that resurrection is real and reassures us of God's knowledge even when life seems bleak. It is actually the first reading to demonstrate that the resurrection from the dead and it reassures us that God does know what will happen at a time when life seems to be drawing to a slow end, beyond hope. Life is always an exercise in faith, in love, and at certain overly demanding moments also an exercise in hope. Mark's Gospel reminds us that good will triumph over evil. It is all God's to do with as he wishes and for now, he does not wish that this victory should happen today. Why is it true that good will triumph? Because of the very nature of evil, which is an absence of good and the effort to reduce the good in creation, and the rejection of life, including your own. Evil does not have 'being.' It does not have



any life of its own. All creation has come from God, and it must be good because all things that have come from God are good and can be nothing else. Jesus' own life reflects what he wants for us and from us. He wants us to solider on through adversity by carrying our cross and do our best at each moment to act lovingly.


