



# Fr Dominic's Gospel Message:

Jesus points to children who were living in a time when people had very few possessions. You only had what you earned; you had to work and craft all that you had and work hard to get it. It was not earnt but was received as a gift from God and it was to children that this gift was given. The kingdom rightly belongs to children, to those of us who are eager to be nourished by God.
