# And if any place does not welcome you...

Hospitality remains very vital in the economy of salvation and in the ongoing work of evangelisation. Hospitality to the message and the messenger.

In the Old Testament, Abraham is often remembered for his hospitality to the three divine messengers. This brought the blessing of fruitfulness to Sarah his wife (Genesis 18 Vs 1-14). The Widow at Zarephath survived the raging famine Enquiries Tony Priest Mobile: 0423924774 because of her generosity to the Prophet Elijah (1 Kings 17 Vs 8-16).

Christ in the New Testament experienced generosity though, not withou rejection which made him to remark that: 'a prophet is not without honour except in his own country, among his own relations and in his own house (Mk 6. Vs 4). This experience as recounted in the Gospel of Mark last weekend formed the backdrop for Jesus's mission instruction to the twelve. They were to go without 'carry-on luggage' and to depend on providence. 'And if any place does not welcome vou...'.

Eventually, they went carrying nothing as instructed. However, they returned with success stories as they enjoyed the hospitality of the people contrary to the experience of Christ in his own home of Nazareth.

Like the Twelve Apostles, Bishop Michael Apochi from Nigeria enjoyed his two days holiday visit to the South Coast of News South Wales. He was hosted to Dinner by friends on arrival on Monday. On Tuesday morning after the community mass in Batemans Bay, he enjoyed a big 'break-feast' (breakfast) with the Parishioners. It was not less in Moruya where he had an evening mass with many parishioners and four concelebrating priests, after which he was treated to sumptuous dinner at the presbytery. His parting gift was a beautiful Boat Ride on the "Tenacity". Indeed, Bishop Michael enjoyed your food, company, kind words, prayers and friendship. He also remains grateful to you all for the ongoing support giving to me his priest while ministering among you. Thank you all for your hospitality. May your generosity bring you the reward in
