FIRST RECONCILIATION COMMITMENT MASS

Our faith is best expressed in a context of a journey. A journey with many moments and stop-over: the moments when we celebrate the sacraments including mass and occasions when we stop over to empty, refill, and renew our commitments. To guarantee confidence on the journey, we are always surrounded by the community. A community made up of the family and the faithful as reflected in our gathering this weekend.

The sacramental journey which begins at baptism happens within the context of the community, where Parents, Gods Parents (Sponsor) together with the Faith Community expresses a commitment to bring up the child to be baptized. in the practice of the faith. Within this community the child grows, experiencing more moments: of First Reconciliation and First Eucharist. With these sacraments, the child is renewed and nourished on the journey. Then comes, the big moment: the moment of Confirmation. At this point, the child's gifts are identified and readied for the mission of Christ and his Church in the

Reconciliation is one of the two healing sacraments. In this sacrament, the penitent experiences the forgiving mercies of God. He or she is thereby renewed, recreated, and refreshed through the grace of absolution and therefore, reconciled with self, others and God.

However, to begin, this year's Sacramental Journey, we gather this weekend to express our commitment in preparation for the celebration of the Sacrament of 1st Reconciliation. The first of the three Sacraments received during the school age. To receive this, a deep and sincere preparation is required; preparation on the part of the candidates and a commitment on the part of their Families and the Faithful who commits to accompany the candidates, building a network of prayer and support around the them as they journey to the sacrament of Reconciliation. This is our special focus at all the masses this weekend. And it is about our expression of yes beyond baptism.

We therefore thank all parents and grand parents for accepting to be part of the journey and for offering to witness to their own faith before their child or children. We also acknowledge and welcome all family members, friends, the members of our school and parish community to the celebration of the Eucharist this weekend beginning with the 6pm vigil mass on Saturday 2nd and on Sunday 3rd March at 9am and 5pm respectively. Warmly, we welcome and congratulate all the candidates as they progress on their journey of faith beyond baptism. As we journey with the boys and girls to the Sacrament of first reconciliation, keeping them safe is our priority on every step of the way. -Fr. Martins
