#### SPECIAL TRIBUTE

This weekend, we pay special tribute to some members of our parish community who have distinguished themselves by their presence and by their services to and within the parish community in different ways. These include: Sr. Carmel Drew, Rebecca Klarica and Liz Rodwell.

Sr. Carmel has been part of the part of the parish at different times, but consistently since the last eight years living in St. Joseph's Convent here in Batehaven while facilitating different retreat programs in St. Joseph's House of spirituality in Batehaven and beyond. She was here and there. However, with the demanding ministry of the priests, who were running constantly from pillar to post, Sr. Carmel offered the community the sacrament of presence and a listening ear. She listened 'with the ear of the heart'. She has formerly moved to Narrabri, NSW where she will continue her retreat apostolate. As the Parish pastoral care contact person, she brought warmth to many in the community who were homebound and perhaps isolated. As the parish executive secretary, Rebecca exercised her office with great energy, sensitivity and social skill while working collaboratively with different priests and personnel in succession. She is a 'people person'. Thank You for your selfless services to the community and thanks to the Klaricas for supporting you in your roles. Though you have resigned formally from your position in the parish office, we hope you will continue to give witness to your pastoral vision and be a pastoral presence in our Parish.

Liz Rodwell has on a voluntary basis kept the church cleaned and vacuumed on Mondays over the last ten years. She extended this stewardship to the Presbytery. She kept the Rectory and the Parish Office clean and refreshed for healthy living and official business. Liz was very organised, placing things in their rightful place. Once she finished cleaning, I was conscious not to mess up the kitchen with my cooking! She thought it was great that I could cook telling me, "Oh, the boys don't cook" (meaning, the priests before me). Liz has formally resigned her position to enable her to do full time job in town. Thanks, Liz, for being a blessing to the parish community.

Sr. Carmel, Rebecca and Liz, you may have moved on from your positions in the parish, however, your contributions will always be remembered and appreciated. A million thanks from all of us in the parish of St. Bernard's, Bateman Bay.
