This weekend marks the sixth Sunday of Easter. With this Sunday, two major liturgical and one national event are on the horizon: the solemnity of Ascension and Pentecost and National Reconciliation Week here in Australia. In view of the Ascension, the Gospel of John Chapter 14 recount Jesus' fare well discourse after the Last Supper. In the text, St. John explains the doctrine of the indwelling of the Holy Trinity in the human soul, and the role of

the Holy Spirit in the life of the faithful.

In the discourse, Jesus on the verge of his Death and Ascension promised the followers of the abiding presence of the Triune God (Father, Son and the Holy Spirit) in the one who keeps his word. This promise of God's abiding presence resonates with the Johannine community who saw the Temple in Jerusalem as the symbol of God's presence with His people. Jesus reassures them of his ongoing presence among them. A presence that is no longer restricted to places like the temple, the mountains or in special object like the Ark or particular persons, but being present in each and every individual. God inhabits our hearts so deeply and intimately that we become the visible dwelling place of God.

Jesus in making this promise accompanied it with a condition: to show our love, by keeping his word. To facilitate this, he promised the Holy Spirit, the Breath of God who will teach and lead all to the truth; reminding the faithful of his words while bringing them consolation and peace. This reechoes the theme of this year's National Reconciliation Week: Grounded in Truth-Walk Together with Courage.

The role of the Holy Spirit is many fold: a) to "teach" the disciples the truth; b) to "remind" them of what Jesus had already taught them"; c) to be the "advocate" who will intercede for them, offering them wisdom; d) to be their "comforter" who will bring peace at moments of trials and persecution soon to come. At work since creation, having previously 'spoken through the prophets,' the Spirit will now be with and in the disciples, to teach them and guide them 'into all the truth' (CCC 243). Jesus affirms that even though He will no longer be visibly with them, he will continue to be present among them through the Holy Spirit. The Spirit of Truth will continue teaching them and helping them to understand and to build on what he had already taught them. The Holy Spirit will bring no new revelation but help the followers to deepen their understanding of the revelation given by Jesus. This is visible in the writing of the Sacred Scripture which is the inspired Word of God.

As we reflect on the promise, place and role of the Holy Spirit in our faith and national journey towards reconciliation, we remember our indigenous communities and the 19 girls and boys in Year 6 of St. Bernard's Primary School, who are preparing for the sacrament of Confirmation. In this sacrament, the boys and girls will be empowered by the Holy Spirit in order to give witness to their faith. They will be taught by the Holy Spirit whose gifts and fruits they will witness to as they grow to maturity led by the Spirit of Truth, Justice and Courage walking together to achieve Reconciliation.

Also, one of the major social-cultural and perhaps, ethical problems of our time is isolation. Approximately, about 25% of adults live alone and are truly lonely and isolated. Spouses, parents and children often live as virtual strangers to one another. This is made more challenging by the individual's attachment to the "screen". The promise of the Holy Spirit is to reassure the faithful of Gods' living and life-affirming Presence with each one, yet "hidden" in the very things we so often take for granted. Thus, we are invited to look for and encounter God-with-us, yet hidden in the person sitting next to us, in the words we speak and in our listening. God is with us in our moments of loneliness and isolation, to console and teach us.

We often carry with us the memories of our teachers and mentors. Let us keep in mind the Holy Spirit **Our Faithful Teacher**. He teaches the truth that leads to reconciliation. Fr. Martins
