Forty days after the resurrection of Christ at Easter, we celebrate the solemnity of the Ascension. In some continents of the world, this is celebrated Thursday of the sixth week of Easter These include Africa, Asia, North and South America and in Europe. Subsequently, ten days after the Solemnity of Ascension, the Feast of Pentecost is celebrated to coincide with the 50 days after the resurrection of Christ, the out-pouring of the Holy Spirit was celebrated by the Apostles. However, in Australia, the feast of Ascension is celebrated on the Seventh Sunday of Easter and the following Sunday, Pentecost is celebrated.

Each Sunday, in the Creed, we profess "He ascended into Heaven." Christ's Ascension was the culmination of God's Divine plan for Christ Jesus – his return to his Father with his "Mission Accomplished." Ascension is the grand finale of all Jesus' words and works done for us and for our salvation. As Jesus is now with God in glory, so Jesus is with us now in Spirit: "Lo, I

The feast of the Ascension celebrates one aspect of the Resurrection, namely Jesus' exaltation. The focus of this feast is the Heavenly reign of Christ. The Lord is now "seated at the right hand of the Father" as we profess in the Nicene Creed, meaning He alone is in control of the continuing plan of salvation through the Holy Spirit, unrestricted by time, space or culture. Thus, in the Paschal Mystery, Jesus' Passion, Death, Resurrection, Ascension and the sending of the Holy Spirit form one unbroken reality which is to be understood by Faith. The Ascension means that Jesus, His salvific suffering for our Salvation completed, is with his Father in glory. Being seated at the right hand of the Father is the fulfillment of "the prophet Daniel's vision concerning the Son of Man: 'To him was given dominion and glory and kingdom, that all peoples, nations, and languages should serve him; his dominion is an everlasting dominion, which shall not pass away, and his kingdom one that shall not be destroyed' (Catechism of the Catholic Church [CCC] #664).

The Ascension of Christ is the culmination of his mission, but not the conclusion. At the point of his ascension, he commissioned his disciples with these words: "to Preach the Good News and be my witnesses:" Matthew, Mark and Acts of the Apostles recorded Jesus' last words differently: 1) "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8). 2) "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:19). 3) "Go into all the world and proclaim the good news to the whole creation" (Mark 16:15). All agree that (a) Jesus gave the disciples a mission of bearing witness to him by preaching and living the Good News. They are to tell and re-tell the story of Jesus' life, suffering, death and Resurrection. (b) He assured them of the Divine assistance of the Holy Spirit in the carrying out of this mission. (c) He instructed them to baptise the believers: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." (Mt 16: 19-20).

As we celebrate the solemnity of Ascension, we congratulate the 19 Boys and Girls who receive the sacrament of Confirmation this Sunday. We welcome them to the sacrament by which they will be empowered by the Holy Spirit in order to give witness to their faith. Thanks to their families and Godparents for inspiring and supporting them, the school and parish community for guiding and praying for them and Archbishop Prowse for presiding at the Confirmation Ceremony.
