FATHER | SON | SPIRIT

The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is a basic doctrine in Christianity; it is the mother of all mysteries, understandable not with our heads but with our hearts through faith. It teaches us that there are three distinct Persons in one God, sharing the same Divine Nature. Our minds cannot grasp this doctrine which teaches that 1+1+1 = 1 and not 3. But we believe in this Mystery because Jesus who is God taught it clearly the Evangelists recorded it, the Church Fathers tried to explain it and the Councils of Nicaea and Constantinople defined it as a dogma of Christian Faith (CCC 234, 235, 236)

Importance: 1) All prayers in the Church begin in the Name of the Holy Trinity and end glorifying th Trinity, 2) All Sacraments are administered (we are baptized, confirmed, anointed, our sins are forgiven, and our marriage blessed, and our Bishops, priests and deacons ordained) in the Trinitarian formulae. 3) Where Church bells ring thrice daily, they remind us to pray to the Holy Trinity. 4) We bless ourselves, and the priest blesses us, in the name of the Holy Trinity.

Biblical basis: The sacred scriptures offers us the basic records of the self-revelation of God in Time as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. There are only vague and hidden references to the Trinity in the Old Testament. But the New Testament gives clear teachings on the Holy Trinity. 1) At the Annunciation, God the Father sends His angel to Mary, God the Holy Spirit overshadows her, and God the Son becomes incarnate in her womb Lk. 1.26-38. 2) At the baptism of Jesus, when the Son receives baptism from John the Baptist, the Father's Voice is heard, and the Holy Spirit appears as a Dove Mt. 3. 16-17. 3) At the Ascension, Jesus gives the missionary command to his disciples to baptize those who believe in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit Mt. 28.19. 4) In John, chapters 15-18, we have a detailed account of Jesus' teaching of the role of each Person of the Holy Trinity: a) God the Father creates and provides for His creatures. b) God the Son redeems us and reconciles us with God. c) God the Holy Spirit sanctifies us, strengthens us, teaches us and guides us to God.

A good illustration of the Trinity comes from the world-renowned scientist Dr. Henry Morris (2006). He noted that the entire universe is Trinitarian by design. The universe consists of three things matter, space, and time. Take away any one of those three and the universe would cease to exist. But each one of those is itself a trinity. Matter = mass + energy + motion. Space = length + height + breadth. Time = past + present + future. Thus, the whole universe witnesses to the character of the God who made it (cf. Psalm 19:1).

Lessons: 1) Celebrating the Trinity invites us to be respectful of ourselves and others knowing that everyone carries the image and signature of the triune God. 2) The Trinitarian God abides in us as the Source of our hope, courage, strength and destination. 3) God is a community of persons offering u the model for relationships in the family of father, mother and children. 4) In Baptism we become children of God, implying a Trinitarian relationship in the faith-based community. 5) Let us practice the I-God-my neighbor vertical and horizontal Trinitarian relationship in society by loving God living in others.

Vatican News: Pope Francis makes changes to the Lord's Prayer...

Pope Francis has approved a third edition of the Italian Missal, including changes to the Lord's Prayer and Gloria. On May 22nd during the General Assembly of the Episcopal Conference of Italy, President Cardinal Gualtiero Bassetti announced the approval of a third edition of the Messale Romano. The revised translation will include changes to the Lord's Prayer and Gloria. The Lord's Prayer will change from "and lead us not into temptation" to "do not let us fall into temptation." The Gloria will change from "Peace on earth to people of good will" to "Peace on Earth to people beloved by God." The changes to the Italian Missal was a 16 year undertaking with aims to "contribute to the renewal of the ecclesial community in the wake of the liturgical reform." "Bishops and experts worked on improving the text from a theological pastoral and stylistic point of view, as well as on fine-tuning the presentation of the Missal."

The upcoming change has received confirmation from the Congregation for Divine Worship and Discipline of the Sacraments, recognition of the decisions made by bishop's conferences. In the upcoming months the 3rd Edition of the Messale Romano will be printed and available for use.

2020 PLENARY COUNCIL... announces the national themes for discernment, opening the next phase of the Plenary Council process.

The Plenary Council 2020 moves into its next phase of preparation with the announcement of the National Themes for Discernment that emerged from a historic process of listening to the voices of more than 222,000 people. Between May 2018 and March 2019, almost 17,500 submissions, from individuals and groups of all sizes, addressed the Plenary Council's central question: "What do you think God is asking of us in Australia at this time?"

From the submissions, six National Themes for Discernment have been drowned for consideration as we pray and consider how God is calling the People of God to be a Christcentred Church in Australia that is:

1) Missionary and Evangelizing 2.) Inclusive, Participatory and Synodal 3) Prayerful and Eucharistic 4) Humble, Healing and Merciful 5) A Joyful, Hope-Filled and Servant Community 6) Open to conversion, Renewal and Reform.

Accordingly, the fruits of what is discerned during this time will shape the agenda for the first session of Plenary Council in October 2020. The next discernment process, begins soonest.
