World Day of Migrants & Refugees, Sunday August 25th 2019

Migrant and Refugee Day 2019 is celebrated on Sunday 25th August. Pope Fancis has chosen the theme "It Is Not Just About Migrants" to show up our blind spots and to make sure no -one remains excluded from society, whether a long-time resident or someone newly arrived. Yet still Australia's off-shore detention crisis remains.

"In a word, it is not only the cause of migrants that is at stake; it is not just about them, but about all of us, and about the present and future of the human family ." (excerpt from Pope Francis' 2019 message)

This year, Pope Francis' reminds us that, "the presence of refugees is an invitation to recover some of those essential dimensions of our Christian existence" which include sensitivity to the needs of others. In line with Francis, Catholic Alliance for People Seeking Asylum (CAPSA) is calling on all to respond by joining our voices with other faith communities in this 'Jubilee' Campaign by sending letters to the relevant politicians calling on the Federal Parliament to provide a "Jubilee" or amnesty for the people seeking refuge who have been subjected to the offshore processing policies for the past six years. This campaign is in solidarity with numerous statements from various Christian organisations and groups such as the Naional Council of Churches, The Australian Catholic Bishops Conference, Catholic Religious Australia, the Australian Churches Refugee Taskforce and other Jewish, Muslim and faith leaders who have issued recent statements asking for an act of clemency and a humanitarian solution to the situation offshore for refugees and people seeking asylum.


