

THE SOLEMNITY OF THE HOLY FAMILY

This weekend, we celebrate the solemnity of the Holy family. This solemnity call to mind the family of Joseph, Mary and Jesus.

Joseph was the foster father of Jesus. Mary is the chosen human mother of Jesus. Jesus son of God and son of Mary remains the known child of the family of

Each member of the Holy family remains very important part of the whole family. Minus anyone of them the family will be incomplete. Joseph, identified in our first reading as a father set by God to watch over his children, in this case the Holy Family

They lived in love, compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, patience and forgiveness. This reflects the admonition of St. Paul in his letter to the Colossians in our second reading. They attended the Jewish Passover feast together as a family. They sort the Lord in the temple together when they realised that he was missing.

Lessons

The solemnity of the Holy Family of Joseph, Mary and Jesus calls us to focus attention on our own individual family pictures. In doing this, we are invited to reappreciate the importance of each member of the family, voung or old, strong or frail. Let the oneness not only be seen on the frame of the family picture, taken on an important event, but be visible in the living experiences.

Mary and Joseph experienced rejection. They had no room. They had to give birth to Jesus in a stable. How about making time for the disconnected family members, perhaps creating rooms for one another during this vuletide.

The Holy Family being the model of family life inspires us to live in love, in kindness, in humility, gentleness and forgiveness especially in the face of drought. fires and smoke.
