Mt. 5 vs 29

This weekend, our gospel reading is the continuation of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount contained in Matthew' gospel, chapter five. In the narrative, Jesus offered a new un-

derstanding of the Mosaic law, calling his audience to cultivate a better appreciation of the law compared to the teachers of the law, challenging them to a more authentic piety than that of the Pharisees, and a more positive attitude towards God, the world and neighbour.

In the passage he further challenged the disciple in strong terms to 'pluck out' anything that might cause them to act in a manner that is incongruous with God's law and disrespectful of neighbour. While scripture scholars warned against the literal interpretation of this expression. Jesus is insistent on the need for his listeners to eschew themselves from the possible occasions and events that might lead them to a reprehensible acts and end.

At a time when road fatalities are blamed on human error induced by alcohol and phone usage: when domestic violence is blamed on drugs and addiction; with some families losing their entire wealth to poker machines and gambling; with some of our young people performing poorly in academics while spending hours being entertained on screens, the admonition of Jesus to 'pluck it out' in Matthew's gospel remains absolutely valid.

Additionally, the governments and businesses around the world are being challenged to put ethical, social and environmental issues at the forefront, instead of being driven purely by profit and self- interest, we look to the gospel, fully trusting the words of Jesus as he calls us to live by the law of love. Led by his Spirit, we can open our hearts to the needs of the world.

Ever generous God,

You inspired Saint Mary MacKillop to live your mission of bringing hope and encouragement to those marginalised, disheartened, lonely, sick and needy. With confidence in your generous providence and praying with Saint Mary MacKillop we place our needs before you.
