SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

AS we journey through the Easter Season and draw nearer to the Feast of Pentecost, the readings at Mass point us to the promise of the great Gift of the Holy Spirit that Jesus will send to His followers after he returns to the Father.

We know that the Holy Spirit is the third person of the Blessed Trinity, equal to the Father and the Son and is truly God. However, perhaps the Holy Spirit does not always have a predominant place in our spiritual lives, perhaps we find it more difficult to pray to the Holy Spirit as we do Jesus and the Father. As we journey towards the feast of Pentecost, it is a great opportunity for us to reawaken and/or deepen our love and devotion towards the Holy Spirit, who permeates our lives and is constantly at work in us.

A great prayer that I have always found very helpful is one from Cardinal Joseph Mercier (1851-1926). He writes:

> "I am going to reveal to you the secret of sanctity and happiness. Every day for five minutes control your imagination and close your eyes to the things of sense and vour ears to all the noises of the world in order to enter into yourself. Then, in the sanctity of your baptised soul (which is the temple of the Holy Spirit) speak to that Divine Spirit, saving to Him:

Oh, Holy Spirit, beloved of my soul, I adore you. Enlighten me, guide me, strengthen me, console me. Tell me what I should do; give me your orders. I promise to submit myself to all that you desire of me and to accept all that you permit to happen to me. Let me only know your will.

If you do this, your life will flow along happily, serenely, and full of consolation, even in the midst of trials...this submission to the Holy Spirit is the secret of sanctity."

The reading from the Acts of the Apostles this Sunday bears witness to two very important and closely connected sacraments; Baptism and Confirmation. Peter and John are sent to the baptised Christians in Samaria to lay hands on them for them to receive the Holy Spirit. We too have received this same Holy Spirit at our Baptism which was strengthened at our Confirmation. Knowing that each of us have a vital role to play and that our lives have a purpose and meaning. let us call upon the Holy Spirit in these times of solitude, asking for an increase in the Gifts of the Spirit and in turn attentively listen to the Spirit's promptings deep in our hearts with great trust and openness.

So let us emerge from our extended time of reflection and solitude with a heart renewed and strengthened by the Holy Spirit and enfolded in the love of Mary whom we especially honour as Mother and Witness during May
