

"God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not be lost but may have eternal life."

From Advent until today, the Church has put before us the magnificent manifestations of God's love and mercy towards all humanity. In Advent and Christmas, we recalled and celebrated the long-awaited birth of Our Saviour, in Lent and Holy Week we travelled with Christ into His passion and death which he endured for our salvation. At Easter, we celebrated the victory He won over evil, suffering and death and just last week, we celebrated the coming of the Holy Spirit and the birth of the Church. Now the Church directs our attention to the source of all these gifts: the Most Holy Trinity.

We know and believe that in God there are Three Divine Persons equal in all things but distinct; Father, Son and Holy Spirit and each of these Divine Persons is one and the self-same God. However, it is often said that we never really know someone until we know what is in their heart- what motivates them, what they're looking for, why they do what they do. In the conversation between Jesus and Nicodemus in the Gospel today, Jesus lays bare the heart of God. In this conversation, Jesus reveals to us His inner life of love, a union of reciprocal love between the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. It was love that motivated God to create us, it was love that motivated God to save us and it was love that motivated God to adopt us as His children and make us partakers in His divine life.

No amount of theological study of the Trinity will ever bring us closer to the mystery of what the Trinity is. If we want to begin to understand the Trinity, we must draw near to the heart of Christ with all our uncertainties, weaknesses and our unrest. It is only when we appropriate and assimilate into our very beings the mysteries we have celebrated since Advent, through prayer and a life of love, that the mystery of the Trinity begins to manifest itself to us.

Paradoxically, the more we seek to understand God, the more we begin to understand ourselves, and how precious we must be to our Creator that He "gave his only Son" in order that we "may not be lost but may have eternal life.'
