Feast of Corpus Christi

As our Church Community begins to gather again, it is very clear that the inability to celebrate the Eucharist has made us realise the value of breaking the bread of the Word and the Eucharist together.

In our Readings this weekend we are reminded of the 'manna' from heaven in Moses' time seen as food for their journey; but Paul and Jesus talk about spiritual sustenance. 'This is the bread come down from heaven; not like the bread our ancestors ate; they are dead,

but anyone who eats this bread will live forever'. The time away from receiving this 'Bread from Heaven' may help me to reflect and appreciate this overwhelming fact that Christ lives in me and I live in Him.

This Body of Christ has been active in our world through the actions of those who have taken up the Challenge of Christ in St Teresa of Avila's words: 'Christ has no Body now but yours, no hands, no feet on earth but yours . Yours are the eyes through which He looks with compassion on this world.' During this Covid 19 time we had to see with 'new eyes' and recognise Christ in the breaking of the bread in so many people's lives. We have witnessed those who have freely shared loving acts of neighbourliness and kindness.

So why do we celebrate this Feast? When Christ left the earth in human form he left behind the gift of His Body and Blood, this gift which is an all-encompassing Presence of Christ in the Universe. When we hear the words: 'This is My Body' we are being invited into an awareness of the sacredness of all humanity, of all creatures and all that exists. The words, 'This is My Blood' are a call to recognise the presence of Christ suffering in our world today.

The celebration of the Eucharist and the feast of Corpus Christi are a reminder to me to become the Bread of Christ's presence and to appreciate the Source of this Presence in every encounter, and in all of creation. God bless.
