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Reflection by Fr Michael Tate

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
In the Jewish story of the creation of Adam, the author has God fashion a figure of a human being out of damp earth, and then breathes into the nostrils of this clay figure. It becomes "Adam". In Hebrew, the word for breath, wind, or Spirit is the same, so this story tells us that we become human when the Holy Spirit is breathed into our very being. St Paul tells the early converts in Rome, those recently baptized, and therefore tells us who are baptized:

"The Spirit of God has made his home in you." Since your baptism, the Holy Spirit, the Breath of God, dwells in you in a special way. Baptism re-creates us, sharing in the life of the true Adam.

We could pause for a moment to pray: Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and enkindle *in* them the fire of your love.

Childlike Wonder

Children receive and give love spontaneously. We hear Jesus **exclaim** in today's gospel that God has revealed 'things' to 'mere children'. Wouldn't it be wonderful to become so like children that we could really 'hear' God's message? A message of love, peace and forgiveness.

One thing I think we find difficult is to believe that God loves us no matter what. If we can trust in that belief how simple our lives would be. We find ourselves often trying to measure up so that God will love us. "Come to me all who labour and are heavily burdened .. I will give you rest'. We need to stop analysing ourselves and God, and simply rest in that love.

One burden that we sometimes carry is the need to always be right! If we let go of that burden it is amazing how we become comfortable with making mistakes and hence 'not knowing', and being open to new insights and discoveries.

We are given encouragement in the reading from **Zechariah**! It is a joyful one! Jesus has conquered the earth and **Romans** tells us that 'the Spirit of God' lives in us! Can we just simply sit with that and rejoice!

In today's readings we are assured that Jesus and the Father are one! A beautiful relationship that is offered to us through the Scriptures. We are offered that relationship with the knowledge that to 'know' God entails a communion of love, creating deep intimacy. That is the main message that Jesus exclaims about to His Heavenly Father.

So today, let us try and embrace the childlike qualities that open us up to new discoveries and revelations – play, wonder, exploration, experimentation and questioning. God is ever longing and waiting for us to respond to **Grace** and **Truth** in childlike wonder!


OUR LADY HELP OF CHRISTIANS
